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About Deerfield-Windsor

Founded in 1964, Deerfield-Windsor School is an independent, coeducational, college preparatory day school enrolling students in pre-kindergarten through grade 12 on two campuses in Southwest Georgia. DWS's Nottingham Campus includes our Middle School with grades 6 thru 8 and Upper School with grades 9 thru 12. The Nottingham Campus has an enrollment of approximately 316 students including the Class of 2021 with 56 students.

Admission to Deerfield-Windsor is selective and based on applicant's academic record, admission testing scores, writing sample, and teacher recommendations. Currently, our student population consists of 10.65% ethnic minorities. For the 2020-21 school year, more than \$640,000 in tuition assistance was awarded to 20.31% of the students. Each Upper School student is required to complete 55 hours of community service. Historically, 100% of DWS graduates are accepted into colleges or universities.

COVID Statement

Deerfield-Windsor School transitioned to virtual learning on 3/16/2020 following our school closure due to COVID-19 mandates. Upper School classes met using a combination of asynchronous and synchronous teaching and followed the normal daily schedule. Grading policies remained unchanged; however, all students were exempted from semester exams.

For the 2020-2021 academic year, Deerfield-Windsor is opening with in-person instruction five days a week with a distance learning option. In the distance learning option, students will be attending in-person classes via web platform and are expected to be an active participant. Distance learners will also be required to take all assessments on campus.

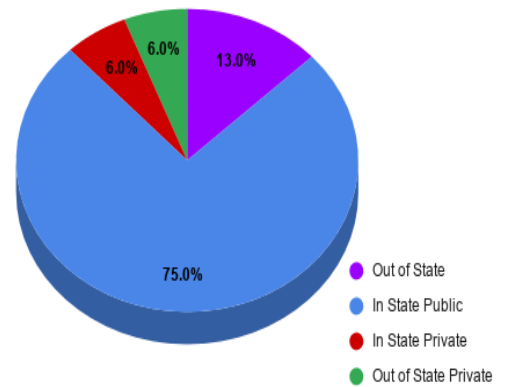
