SCHOOL PREPAREDNESS

NEW PROTOCOLS

- **Safety Protocol Compliance** In order to keep our community safe, it is essential that students follow safety protocols. Students are required to prescreen before coming to school, wear masks, and maintain 6' social distancing as much as possible. If a student is violating safety protocols they will be written up by a teacher or administrator and the following consequences will apply:
 - ***1st Offense***: The student will meet with the Assistant Head of School for Community Life and parents/guardians will be notified.
 - ***2nd Offense***: The student will meet with the Assistant Head of School for Community Life, parents/guardians will be notified, and the student will be sent home.
 - ***3rd Offense***: The student will meet with the Head of School, parents/guardians will be notified, and the student will be moved to remote learning for at least 14 days.

HEALTH AND SAFETY CHECKLIST

DAILY HEALTH CHECK

Every morning prior to arriving on campus, please do a daily temperature check. Your temperature should be below 100°F.



Additionally, check to see if you have any of the following symptoms that are new to you:

- Fever
- Chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Sore throat
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Congestion or new runny nose
- Muscle or body aches
- Loss of taste or smell
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

100% REMOTE STUDENT OPTION

- We are committed and prepared for families who have elected for their student to attend 100% remotely. Students will participate fully in the academic curriculum.
- Student orientation for Freshman / Transfer students who will be 100% remote. Ongoing support from teachers, advisors.
- Remote students on Zoom will be “virtually present” in the classroom and visible on Gallery View on large flat screen TVs in each classroom.
- Changing from 100% Remote to Hybrid requires a seven day advance notice to ensure healthy and safety protocols. Changing from Hybrid to Remote requires no advance notice.
