Deaths

- Liberata (Libby) DiVecchio passed into eternity on July 16, 2020 after a ten-year courageous battle with lymphomas. She was born on September 11, 1935 to Fiore and Linduccia Brandolino in San Vittorino, a little town nestled in the mountains of Italy. Life was difficult there and Liberata often told stories of being raised in a small village with none of the luxuries we are all accustomed to. At the age of 18 she immigrated to America and a new life. It was in America that she married her husband John DiVecchio and in May they celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary. While primarily a homemaker, Libby did work a few jobs including being a seamstress for Al Baskin and she retired from Joliet Central High School where she worked in the cafeteria for many years. She was a member of the Church of St. Anthony ever since she arrived in America. She was also an active member of the American Italian Cultural Society and she could be found volunteering at their monthly spaghetti dinners and the Festa Italiana.
- Silas Ellingson age 92 passed away on August 10, 2020. He began his teaching career in 1950, and taught in ND, WY, MT, JTHS and JJC. He was a member of NCTM, SUAA, NEA, AFT and The United Church of Christ for 50 years. He was chairman of the JJC mathematics department for nearly 30 years. His summers were spent traveling. He and his family visited all 50 states and many foreign countries such as China, Africa, Germany, Ireland, Russia and many others.
- Dr. Karen Freeman A Life Extraordinarily Well Lived. Karen passed away on Friday, May 22, 2020, at Advocate Christ Medical Center in Oak Lawn, IL. She was born in Champaign, IL. She taught at Joliet West High School, where she was a co-sponsor of the Multicultural Club and directed fashion shows, talent shows, and other events for high school students. She also taught at Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. College Preparatory High School in Chicago. Dr. Freeman was a scholar and educator. She was a longtime professor, teaching at Chicago State University, Roosevelt University, and other Chicago area colleges. She was a teacher of teachers, and a stellar researcher and lecturer, presenting at universities and academic institutions in nations around the world. Dr. Freeman earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Southern Illinois University, with a double major in History and Government, a Master of Education degree from the University of Illinois at Chicago, and a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Public Policy Analysis and Administration from the University of Illinois at Chicago. She even entertained the idea of pursuing a law degree. Dr. Freeman received the 2011 Outstanding Faculty

The American Leadership Initiative honored Dr. Freeman with the Excellence in Leadership Award. She was recognized by Cambridge Who's Who, Who's Who Among Professional Women, Who's Who in the Midwest, and Who's Who in American Education. She also served on the Golden Apple Selection Committee. She enjoyed horseback riding, and as a child, she loved playing the piano. She made her friends feel like family, and she especially enjoyed time commiserating with her family, many friends and colleagues.

- Reinhold Fritz, age 80, passed away peacefully on January 31, 2020, with his family by his side. Reinhold was born December 11, 1939 in Kulczyn, Poland, even if he wouldn't say so, and moved to Germany shortly after. As a teenager, he and his family moved to the United States. Reinhold was known for his wonderful sense of humor and his enormous amount of knowledge. He was a German teacher for 38 years for JTHS. He also was a football and track coach.
- Shirley M. Gibbs, Beloved U.S. History teacher for thirty years at Joliet Township High School, West Campus passed away on July 24, 2020. A favorite of many years of West Campus students. She was a great influence to many to continue with their interest in history. "May she fly with the angels."
- John W. Murray, age 93, passed away January 30, 2020. Loving husband to Marie for 68 years. John attended St. Dennis and St. Joseph grammar schools. In 1985 after 34 rewarding years in the field of Physical Education, he retired. John was a true patriot, a man of high ideals. Honesty, integrity, kindness, and caring were his forte.
