Free Breakfast and Lunch

We are pleased to inform you that under a new USDA funded program MARYVILLE CITY SCHOOLS will offer **FREE MEALS TO ALL STUDENTS** starting Tuesday, September 8, 2020. Below are the details you should know:



- All students will be served under this USDA program.
- One regular (reimbursable) lunch meal AND one regular (reimbursable) breakfast meal are included.
- Funding for this program will run until December 31 or until federal funding expires.
- Items considered à la carte" (any extra servings or snack items), will still require payment.
- Payment for à la carte items can be paid with cash or on a student lunch account (with student ID).
- Digital learners can pick up free meals at their school by following all previously communicated COVID-related protocols. Contact your school with any questions.
- This program does not allow for food distribution to students who are not enrolled in our district.
- This program does not require an application for participation.

IMPORTANT NOTE for families who qualify for free or reduced-priced meals. While this program will allow your children to receive free meals at school this fall, we do not know what could happen after the program ends. For that reason, we HIGHLY RECOMMEND completing the free lunch application before the September 10 deadline, at this link: https://www.applyforlunch.com/Application.


Changes to Instructional Method

HOUSEHOLD **Close Contact Protocol**

NON-HOUSEHOLD **CLOSE CONTACT**

- CLOSE CONTACT TRACING: begins two days prior to the cases's symptom onset or two days prior to a positive test date if asymptomaci.
 EXPOSURE: Less than 6 feet of distance for longer than 10 minutes.
 ISOLATION: 14 day isolation begins when the close contact discontinues contact with the positive individual.

HOUSEHOLD **CLOSE CONTACT**

- · CLOSE CONTACT TRACING for nousehold members begins two days prior to the case's symptom onset or two days prior to a positive test date if asymptomatic EXPOSURE: Less than 6 feet of distance for loans than 10
- distance for longer than 10 minutes

 ISOLATION: 14-day isolation begins when the household close contact discontinues contact with the positive
 - QUARANTINE POSSIBLE: Where it is possible to quarantine a positive individual, the 14-day solation begins when guarantine
- solution begins when qualified begins.

 QUARANTINE NOT POSSIBLE: Where it is NOT possible to quarantine, the 14-day isolution begins AFTER the 10-day isolution for the positive household member.

 Cither the family or the Health Department will inform the school when the 14-day isolution starts

POSITIVE CASE: 10-Day minimum isolation

CLOSE CONTACT WITH A POSITIVE CASE: 14-Day mir

CLOSE CONTACT WITH A POSITIVE CASE IN THE HOUSEHOLD 14-Day isolation AFTER separation from the positive case

Someone in your household tests POSITIVE for COVID-19!

If the POSITIVE case is a student, the school will issue a 10-day isolation notice. Plus, all household contacts who are MCS students or employees will receive a 14-Day Household isolation Notice.

The Health Department will conduct telephone interviews to determine isolation dates for all household close contacts - based on the ability to fully quarantine the positive individual from the household.

IS IT POSSIBLE TO FULLY QUARANTINE SOMEONE IN THIS HOUSEHOLD?

NO

Household Close contact(s) will wait until after the positive person completes the 10-day isolation to begin the 14-day close contact isolation. The Health Department should notify the school and the family should follow Health Dept. guidance and not return to school until the full isolation period is YES

The Health Department must have assurance and evidence that the positive case will not share any living spaces (bathroom, kitchen, living room, etc.) with the nonpositive household members. Household close contact(s) can then tollow the close non-household contact guideline and return to school after a 14-day isolation.

(doe) if the health department receives assurances that household social distancing will occur for the full 10 days of the positive person's case." The school expects families or the Health Department to report the start date for the 14-Day isolation period in order to calculate the return date to school.
