COURSE RIGOR

St. George's challenges and engages our students in creative and exciting ways.

THE LEVEL OF RIGOR OFFERED IS AS FOLLOWS:

ADVANCED: These courses represent the most sophisticated and highest form of rigor a student can pursue. They are denoted with an (A) on the transcript.

HONORS: These courses are the next most rigorous level of curriculum and are more challenging than our regular course offerings. They are denoted with an (H) on the transcript.

REGULAR: All non-Advanced or Honors coursework, which is college preparatory and challenging for students.

GRADING SYSTEM & ACADEMIC HONORS

CUM LAUDE SOCIETY: Awarded to a small number of performers who have a high grade point average, have maintained a rigorous course load throughout their time at SG, are of high moral character, and who have been positive contributors to the community.

TOP FIFTEEN SCHOLARS: Awarded at the opening of the school year to those students who have the highest weighted grade point average across the entire school for the previous school year.

HEAD OF SCHOOL'S COMMENDATION: Awarded at the end of each term to students who have earned all grades A- or higher.

HONOR ROLL: Awarded at the end of each term to students who maintain an average of B or better, and all effort marks must be at least "Satisfactory."

COVID-19 UPDATE: As part of the school's re-opening for the 2020-2021 school year, St. George's has shifted from a trimester calendar to a semester calendar to accommodate for a new Hy-Flex model of teaching. As such, some seniors have been granted waivers for their graduation requirements of three trimesters each in Art and Theology & Religious Studies.

SUMMER TERM: Beginning in 2020, students were able to take select courses during a summer term for credit. These courses are listed on the transcript and are denoted with an "S" at the beginning of the Course ID.
