Depending on the alternative diagnosis, please follow the illness policy in the regular Family Handbook.</p>	<p>Child or staff may return to school 14 days after last close contact, IF no symptoms develop NOR do they have a positive COVID-19 test.</p> <p>Individuals who receive a positive COVID-19 test should provide a statement from their physician clearing them to return as long as that is in line with school policy.</p>	<p>Child or staff may return to school 10 days after first positive COVID-19 test or symptoms, 24 hours fever free** and improvement in respiratory system, assuming they have not developed symptoms since that test.</p> <p>Individuals who receive a positive COVID-19 test should provide a statement from their physician clearing them to return as long as that is in line with school policy.</p>

\* Recovery is defined as the resolution of symptoms and absence of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications.

\*\* Fever-free is defined as the absence of fever without the use of fever-reducing medicines.

## **Testing**

Testing is done based on CDC recommendation for those with symptoms, those who do not have symptoms, but came in close contact with someone who has tested positive, and those who are in a CDC-defined high-risk group. MSD recommends that employees and families utilize their primary care physician (PCP) to seek medical care. CDC does not recommend widespread, asymptomatic testing, and instead recommends that all individuals take preventative measures including wearing face coverings and maintaining physical distancing to reduce the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

MSD will coordinate with the Durham County Department of Public Health to determine when and how to inform families, students, faculty and staff as appropriate and maintain privacy and confidentiality as required by law. MSD may also decide to issue notifications above and beyond what public health notification guidelines call for. Suspected, presumed, and confirmed cases will be reported to the MSD COVID-19 response team, including but not limited to the Administrative Team.
