Art projects- have your child request items (colors, supplies, etc.), talk about what your making, work on following directions	Read a book together- talk about what you see, ask "wh" questions, sequence events, retell story	Play a board game together- practice following directions, turn taking, and appropriate social language	Play I Spy in your house by looking for things of different colors. "I spy something green."	What is your favorite color? Draw a picture of something that is your favorite color.
Who are your friends at school? List as many as you can.	What kind of toys do you like to play with? What do you like about them?	Where does your family like to go together? Name as many places as you can.	Read a book together. Ask your child who is in the story and what they do.	Practice naming body parts when washing your child's face
Talk about clothes and wear something green today	Mystery Box: Hide items in a container, (empty tissue box) Reach in and pull out an object: label it, describe it, say a sentence "I see ___ or I found ___"	Cooking is a great language activity. Label food items you are use & have your child follow simple directions to help (pour, mix)	Watch TV together, ask questions about the show during the commercial breaks	Make a collage of things from the same category
Read a book together. Talk about the setting and the characters	Help your child get dressed. Talk about what goes on 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc	Play hide and seek! Talk about where you are found.	Take a walk outside- label objects you see and describe them.	Read a book together. Ask your child to label/point to pictures/details on the pages.
Play "Simon Says"- have your child follow simple directions.	Take a walk around the home- label objects and talk about functions.	Pass a ball back and forth, say each other's name to gain attention and say "Your turn"	Help your child sort toys from biggest to smallest, longest to shortest, etc.	Sing your child's favorite song together- take turns for different parts.
