A big thank you to all our families for partnering with us to reinforce these routines at home, and by demonstrating your daily commitment by completing screenings, adhering to mask protocols and reducing your families exposure while off campus. We are all in this together and we are grateful for the care you have shown to keep our entire community safe.


We also recognize that there are rising numbers of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Ontario. While we feel confident with the health and safety protocols we have put in place at school, we recognize that there is always a chance COVID-19 may be contracted by a member of our community. As such, we wanted to clarify the steps that will be taken as well as the process for communicating with you in the event that this transpires.

To reiterate, we have not and do not currently have an active COVID-19 case in the SHS community but wanted to be proactive in explaining the process should this occur.

Firstly, it is important to note that the authority for tracking, tracing and communicating actions related to mitigating the community spread of COVID-19 lies with Toronto Public Health (TPH) - not The Sterling Hall School. As such, we share information with TPH and they provide instructions to both the school and to SHS families directly. The TPH contact tracer team acts to quickly and efficiently isolate individuals or groups who may have been exposed, at the levels outlined in their criteria, to limit potential impact on the wider community. Decisions to remove individuals or cohorts from school, or even to close the school in the event of an outbreak, falls to TPH - and we will comply with all directions by the Health authority.

As it relates to sharing specific information with our community, SHS has a legal obligation <u>not to communicate</u> directly with parents, students and faculty regarding personal health information, unless specifically authorized to do so by TPH. We will not be allowed to disclose the name, class or grade of any student or staff member who may have contracted the virus. These measures are in place to respect and protect individual and families' personal health information - and SHS will adhere to these expectations.

Given our close-knit community, as well as the prevalence of social media, it may be the case that impacted individuals choose to share information before SHS is permitted to do so. Please know that while official communication from SHS will come as quickly and transparently as regulations permit, it is reasonable to anticipate that our community may learn unofficial information prior to any official communication from the school. We thought it prudent to explain why this may occur, and ask for your patience and understanding as we comply with these guidelines.
