Student parking is available in the LAM lot across from IWA at the intersection of Jackson and Capitol streets.

Parking applications can be emailed to Ms. West or submitted to the front office on the first day of school. Parking can be paid for with a check made out to LAM Parking. Please remember

that the \$150 LAM parking fee is for first semester only, and is subject to change for the second semester.

Once the application and payment are submitted, students will immediately be given a parking permit to place on the dashboard of her car.

LAM Parking knows that students' first day of school is either Sept. 21 or Sept. 22, and students will not be ticketed on those days. *Beginning Sept. 23, tickets will be issued for all vehicles without a parking permit visible on their dashboard.*
