Civics: Civics has started off extremely well. We looked at the importance of civic participation in a democracy, our 1st Amendment freedoms, and the importance of the 14th Amendment. Language Arts: Students are exploring the idea of identity and perspective through the analysis and discussion of memoirs, and they will soon be practicing their own personal writing in a similar style.
