My attention has been devoted to finalizing a draft plan to begin transitioning students back into classrooms, which I will be presenting to the Board of Education on Monday. In the meantime, I want to thank our parents and teachers for working together to provide remote learning to our students to ensure a continuity of educational services until such time as we reopen our schools for in-person instruction. Regardless of the instructional model we implement, the partnership between school and community is essential for student success.

Opening schools in the midst of a pandemic is a highly charged topic of debate in our community and communities across our country. I know that emotions run high. I do ask, however, that conversations and debate around this issue remain civil and respectful of differing opinions. None of us created this pandemic. All of us want our children back in school. We are in this together.

# 1. A return to Phase 3 of the Governor's Restore Illinois Plan
