

### Topic home learning grid

During your time off school we would like you to find out about different places and countries. These have been designed to be practical and open ended for you to have fun completing. There are activities for all different ages and abilities. Siblings can complete the same task If It makes things easier! We recognise that many parents may be working at the same time, so have tried to Include some activities that can be more Independently done, whilst also making some more practical activities for those whose parents may be able to be more Involved with their activities.

Learn a song or dance that comes from your country choice.	Make a leaflet advertising a tourist attraction in your country. Younger children could draw and label pictures of attractions - or print them off and label them on a poster.	Learn to count to ten in your country's language. learn some key words eg 'hello', 'please' etc	Draw the flag of your country and colour it the right colours.	Make a dish that your country is famous for.
Design a menu for someone using ingredients from your country eg brie from France, mango from the Caribbean etc Younger children could draw pictures of foods and label	Design and make a leaflet about your country. Include sections such as food, clothing, attractions. Younger children could make a poster	Use an atlas or look online to locate where your country is in the world. Draw a map of your country and label the surrounding countries or seas.	Find out interesting facts about your country and make a fact page eg tallest mountain, longest river, currency, time difference, rulers etc. You could compare it to England.	Draw some animals eg cow, dog, cat. Label your animal with the English word but also the word used in your country.
Create an A to Z journey around the world, choosing either cities or countries. CHALLENGE: Can you create an A to Z with where the country and city/town share the same letter, e.g. Adelaide, Australia. Mark your journey on a map.	Plan a holiday to your dream destination. You must include prices for flights, accommodation, activities.	Consider the fictional city of Wakanda in Marvel's 'The Black Panther'. Draw/ design a map of what the area looks like. Think about the human and physical geography.	Find the lowest and highest cities on the planet. What are the differences? Similarities?	Design a postcard of your favourite place. Send it to a friend!
Find out about the traditional dress of 5 countries. Draw and label pictures of your findings.	Design a map of a new town, what sort of buildings will it need eg library, police station, shops etc	Design a football kit in the country's colours	Do a traffic survey from your house. Watch and record the different vehicles that go past and make a graph/ table to show the results.	Make a new undiscovered island and make labels to show what the different features are. You could draw it, make it out of lego, make it in the garden etc

<p>Make a ticket for a pretend trip. Is it a bus ticket or a plane tick or a ticket for a boat ride? Or something else?</p>	<p>Read a story about an unusual place. Where is your story set?</p>	<p>Count how many steps it takes for you to make a journey in your house. How many steps is it from your bedroom to the kitchen?</p>	<p>Do you know another way of measuring a journey other than counting steps? Could you use building bricks or felt tips laid end to end.</p>	<p>Plan a teddy bear's picnic to take on a pretend trip. Share out your food so that you and your bear have a fair amount each. How will you know it is fair?</p>

Take turns to have a go and try to remember all of the things that other people packed.</p>	<p>Make a reading den to sit in and share a story. Can you make your den match your story in some way?</p>	<p>How many ways can you write your name? e.g. in the mud with a stick, on the patio with a wet brush, in sand or playdough?</p>	<p>Make a model of your favourite place.</p>	<p>Make a up a story with a toy or teddy. Make them go on a journey. Who will they meet? Where will they go?</p>
