 - Mr. Stromberg will provide a list of other items to help with excess carry over. Community Council will discuss at October 5th meeting. An addendum will be presented and voted at our next council meeting concerning expenditures.
- Mr. Stromberg will inform teachers of the Teacher Trust Land Grant.

- Positive opening to the school year. would like to be in school 5 days a week but Safety First.
 The district was smart in the way they handled the opening of school.
- Excited to have students in the building. Kids are amazing. Students have been well behaved.
- Masks and social distancing haven't been a problem.

Community Council Discussion

- Average class size is 38 with 16-18 kids in class each day (exception would be PE and Choir)
- Currently have three lunches with approximately 170 students in each lunch
- Canvas has been difficult causing extra pressure and stress. It would help if we could send links in assisting parents with canvas and electronic device instructions.
- Suggestions made of a mentoring program for those who need additional help in math/science.
 Suggestion made having teachers record their lectures (video) and allow students to watch.
- Discussed SEL (Social, Emotional, Learning). Each month a new concept will be addressed in helping students with stress management. This month the concept is Think before you Speak.
- Discussion was made on saying the Pledge of Allegiance each day. Mr. Stromberg said we do it each Monday and will now do it on Tuesday as well. Wednesday and Thursday will be done in each individual class.

Community Council Elections

- Discussion was made to reduce the parent community council from seven openings to five openings.
- Brian Bolinder motioned to reduce the number from seven to five and Tiffany Rees seconded the motion.
 - Motion passed unanimously.
