



## TRAVEL POLICY

### For All Marianapolis Students Traveling during the Coronavirus Pandemic

The coronavirus pandemic is an ever-evolving and challenging threat to all our community members. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, travel increases your chances of contracting or spreading COVID-19. The School is responsible for providing a safe and healthy environment. As part of a broader effort to limit the transmission of COVID-19 from place to place, personal travel (domestic and international) is discouraged while school is in session.

Students who choose to engage in personal travel must follow these guidelines:

- Review travel guidelines set by [CDC](#)
- Provide advanced notice to [David DiCicco, Assistant Head](#)
- If you reside in a state listed on Connecticut's Travel Advisory, your commute to school is not considered "personal travel" and you are currently allowed on campus.
- If you choose to travel (or are exposed to a household member who travels) to a state listed on the [Connecticut Travel Advisory](#) or a country considered high-risk by [CDC](#), self-quarantine for 14 days upon return, before resuming any activities on and/or off campus with Marianapolis faculty, staff and/or students (Connecticut's Executive Order 7111 guidelines for travel to affected states, with a stay less than 24 hours, is not an exemption to our school policy for personal travel)
  - Quarantine must take place off campus
  - Students, who are not ill, are required to attend class remotely during their quarantine time
- Follow the Daily Self-Monitoring Checklist and inform Assistant Head or Health Office if you develop COVID like symptoms

We encourage our community members to follow the CDC, and State of Connecticut, recommendations and to make smart choices on and off campus. Discovery of a student compromising our community members, by participating in a COVID-19 high-risk activity, may result in disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.
