Modified Full Return to In-person Instruction Summary

- All students grades 1-8 to attend 5 days a week for 4 hours and 55 minutes a day starting on October 7th.
- KDG to attend 2.5 hours a day in an AM/PM model. No Full Day kindergarten. All remaining deposits will be returned.
- Remote-Only will still be offered to families who prefer to not attend in-person instruction. All families will be able to re-elect. Must elect for remote-only through Feb 5th.
- Student assignments may change.
- No lunch served.
 - School days greater than 5 hours require lunch service (NSLP participants can receive a box lunch to take home).
 - Lunch presents the greatest potential for transmission of COVID-19.

Why Modified Full Return?

- Part-time hybrid was considered, but not recommended because it cannot provide the level of support for all students that our community demands.
 - Original hybrid plan was intended as a short-term transition back to a full return
 - Hybrid models contain limited synchronous instructional support.
- 68% of parents surveyed supported or strongly supported a full return compared to 56% for a hybrid.
- Modified Full Return plan is supported by the PEA.
- 80% of staff were pleased with the safety plan implementation during the September 8th and 9th in-person days.

Why Modified Full Return? (cont)

- Updated guidance from IDPH along with availability of rapid response antigen testing will reduce the number of students in required quarantine.
- Our current staffing levels can support in-person instruction.

Is it Safe to Return?

- We have consistently said it is safe to reopen schools.
- There is no community-wide spread at this time.
- We already have students attending school daily.
- There have been no major outbreaks in the surrounding schools hosting full in-person.
- We are not the only school district considering a full return at this time.
 - Frankfort 157C is preparing for full return
 - North Palos 117 is full return
 - Palos Heights 128 is full return
 - Evergreen Park 124 is full return

Safety Considerations

- In-person instruction safety plan will be implemented.
- All students and staff will be required to wear masks over their nose and mouth throughout the school day.
 - Mask breaks will be scheduled.
- Social distancing will be done to the greatest extent possible, which most likely will not be 6 ft within classroom.
 - A strict 6 ft. distance will be maintained whenever masks are removed.
 - Desktop barriers will be used in classrooms.
- Additional nursing support, supervisors, and cleaning staff will support safety plan.
- Air-purifying equipment will be installed.
- No lunches will be served.

South Remote Only Plan Overview

- Based upon staffing and scheduling considerations, electing remote only will require a commitment through the end of the 2nd quarter (Feb 5).
- Everyday students will receive 40 minutes each of ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies.
- Classes will be taught over Zoom using Schoology by South teachers after in-person dismissal
- Current teacher assignments will change in many cases
- Honors Math and ALPS will be provided for students currently enrolled in those courses.
- Spanish will be provided for 7th and 8th grade students
- Band will continue remotely for students.
- Asynchronous activities will be assigned for the morning.

 - 20 minutes synchronous special everyday
 - 140 minutes of asynchronous learning activities
- Remote only synchronous instruction may be delivered in the morning or the afternoon
- Grades 3, 4, 5 ALPS students will receive 20 minutes per day
- Math Enrichment will be given to high math students 40 minutes per week
- Students' teachers may change

Decision Tree for Symptomatic Individuals in Pre-K, K-12 Schools and Day Care Programs

Send home or deny entry (and provide remote instruction) if ANY of the following symptoms² are present: Fever (100.4°F or higher), new onset of moderate to severe headache, shortness of breath, new cough, sore throat, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain from unknown cause, new congestion/runny nose, new loss of sense of taste or smell, nausea, fatigue from unknown cause, muscle or body aches.

Medical Evaluation and Testing are Strongly Recommended for ALL Persons with COVID-Like Symptoms.

Status	A. COVID-19 diagnostic test Positive (confirmed case) OR COVID-like symptoms without COVID-19 testing and exposed to confirmed case (probable case)	B. 

Please commit to drive kids if possible


Transportation will be one of the largest hurdles to return
