

BEFORE SCHOOL PROCEDURE

- Drop off begins at 7:30 a.m. The school day begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 3:30 p.m.
- Each student will receive a temperature check before entering campus.

CLASSROOM SAFETY

MIDDLE SCHOOL PASSING PERIODS

- Passing periods have been extended to eight minutes.
- Students may step outside for breaks if desired.

- Hallways will be designed for a one-way directional flow.

FIRST DAY AND BEYOND

MASKS
