1. Welcome- introductions: In attendance are Amanda Mitchell, Stacee Rowher, Jen Merrill, Eric Petersen, Maree Pope, Julie Lundell, and Lori James Not attending: Erika Polley

- 2. Review of Minutes by Mrs. Lundell from last February 2020, and these were approved and seconded by Mrs. Mitchell and Mrs. Pope, respectively
- 3. School Improvement Plan
  - a. Review of data—Dibels/Acadience reading data was reviewed from the beginning of this year as compared to the beginning of the year last year, and we did notice the drop due to time out of face to face instruction from March through May 2020 due to CoVid 19
  - b. Review of goals—1) K-3 students will have at least 65% scoring in typical or better progress category by the end of year Dibels test. 2) 4-6<sup>th</sup> grade students will have an average of 40 or better for their MGP (median growth percentile) for their math Rise (end of level) testing. TAs have been hired to support these two goals, we've purchased a new Ready Math curriculum to support goal #2 as well, and technology licenses/technology will take up any remaining money to help support these two goals.
    3) With our new prosocial/ SEL curriculum, we will have a decrease of 10% or more in discipline referrals as compared to 2019-2020. SEL curriculum, class meet ups and morning

meetings, along with Buddy ups will help to build relationships in the school positively to support this goal.

- 4. School Business—Our typical school population is around 500, but right now, we are only at about 400 students. There has been and will continue to be changing numbers, dependent upon what is happening with CoVid and school schedules. Our largest class is currently 24 students. We anticipate a drop in funding, as the date for these decisions is Oct. 1, 2020, so we don't anticipate having the same funding moving forward as we have had in the past. Even with all the craziness out in the world, our focus is the kids and their learning and safety in school, and at Clinton we want to ensure all that we do our best to be sure this is exactly what happens each day.

Discussion items: Parents volunteered that they felt Canvas was up and running well for their students; YouTube videos were having issues playing on school devices. Younger students are requiring much more support from parents at home with technology. We are able to continue small group instruction and keep those sessions to less than 15 minutes to help avoid any quarantines. There was discussion about the board meeting to revisit the transition to a 4 day school week tonight
