HOW TO GET HERE.

Follow these steps to apply for admission to Mizzou.

- 1 Submit an application online and the \$55 application fee.
- 2 Request that official transcripts be sent from your high school directly to Mizzou using electronic exchange. If your school does not provide that service, have them mail a hard copy to: Undergraduate Admissions, 230 Jesse Hall, Columbia MO 65211.
- 3 Request that official test scores be sent to Mizzou directly from ACT (code: 2382) or the College Board if you took the SAT (code: 6875). If applying test-optional, submit supporting documents.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

You meet the requirements for admission if you have:

- Completed the required high school curriculum with good grades
— AND —
Earned a composite ACT score of 24 or higher
— OR —
Earned an SAT score of 1160 or higher
— OR —
Meet the scale below based on if you are from a ranking or non-ranking school.

Mizzou will accept superscores from both ACT and SAT. Students must request their superscore be sent directly to Mizzou from ACT beginning this fall. SAT superscores will be calculated from all official SAT scores sent to Mizzou from the College Board.

REQUIRED HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Students are expected to follow a college preparatory curriculum that includes at least 17 units of credit (one unit = one year in class).

- English 4 units**
One unit may be in speech or debate. Two units emphasizing composition or writing skills are required.
- Mathematics 4 units**
Algebra I and higher
- Social studies 3 units**
- Science 3 units**
One unit must be a laboratory course.
- Foreign language 2 units**
Same language
- Fine art 1 unit**

* Students who attend non-ranking high schools will be evaluated for admission based upon their core grade point average in required core college-prep courses in combination with their standardized test scores. Standardized test scores not used for admission if applying as test-optional. This is a GPA that MU recalculates with specified courses. It is not the transcript GPA.

** In consideration of the impacts of COVID-19, freshman applicants for the fall 2021 term have the option of being reviewed test-optional. Choosing a test-optional review will mean your admissibility will be determined holistically by a committee. You will be required to submit a personal statement and resume in addition to your official high school transcript as part of your application for admission.

- 2** Log into Scholarship Universe to answer a series of matching questions that will direct you to applications to complete for maximum scholarship consideration – both internal and external. Applications are due Dec. 1.
- 3** For loans and grants, submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by Jan. 1 for priority consideration. Some scholarships require that you submit your FAFSA before the general priority date.
