### **HOW TO GET HERE.**

Follow these steps to apply for admission to Mizzou.

- Submit an application online and the \$55 application fee.
- Request that official transcripts be sent from your high school directly to Mizzou using electronic exchange. If your school does not provide that service, have them mail a hard copy to: Undergraduate Admissions, 230 Jesse Hall, Columbia MO 65211.
- Request that official test scores be sent to Mizzou directly from ACT (code: 2382) or the College Board if you took the SAT (code: 6875). If applying test-optional, submit supporting documents.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

You meet the requirements for admission if you have:

Completed the required high school curriculum with good grades - AND -

Earned a composite ACT score of 24 or higher

- OR -Earned an SAT score of 1160 or higher

Meet the scale below based on if you are from a ranking or non-ranking school.

Mizzou will accept superscores from both ACT and SAT. Students must request their superscore be sent directly to Mizzou from ACT beginning this fall. SAT superscores will be calculated from all official SAT scores sent to Mizzou from the College Board.

### REQUIRED HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Students are expected to follow a college preparatory curriculum that includes at least 17 units of credit (one unit = one year in class).

- \* Students who attend non-ranking high schools will be evaluated for admission based upon their core grade point average in required core college-prep courses in combination with their standardized test scores. Standardized test scores not used for admission if applying as test-optional. This is a GPA that MU recalculates with specified courses. It is not the transcript GPA.
- \*\* In consideration of the impacts of COVID-19, freshman applicants for the fall 2021 term have the option of being reviewed test-optional. Choosing a test-optional review will mean your admissibility will be determined holistically by a committee. You will be required to submit a personal statement and resume in addition to your official high school transcript as part of your application for admission.

Mizzou was the birthplace of modern homecoming traditions. Our annual celebration is one of the nation's most spirited and spectacular college traditions to this day.


Imagine chanting alongside classmates and fellow Tigers at Memorial Stadium, which can seat 61,620 fans for our electrifying games.



College is a big investment with even bigger returns. Staying on top of the financial aid process really pays off. Follow these steps to make sure you get the most out of your tuition dollars.

- Apply for admission to be considered for automatic scholarships. For maximum scholarship consideration, apply to Mizzou before Nov. 15 of your senior year.
- Log into Scholarship Universe to answer a series of matching questions that will direct you to applications to complete for maximum scholarship consideration – both internal and external. Applications are due Dec. 1.
- For loans and grants, submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by Jan. 1 for priority consideration. Some scholarships require that you submit your FAFSA before the general priority date.

- 1. Live in Missouri for 12 consecutive months (August-August)
- 2. Missouri Driver's License
- 3. Missouri voter registration
- 4. Job in Missouri earning at least \$2,000 of taxable income
- 5. Student cannot be claimed as a dependent on a federal income tax return in another state.

### **MORE ABOUT GAINING RESIDENCY:**

- Residency takes one full year, which may start when you begin classes in August of your freshman year.
- You'll be paying nonresident tuition until you are granted residency.
- You can still receive a nonresident scholarship while going through the residency process. Once you become a Missouri resident, you will no longer receive the scholarship.
- You must fill out a petition and provide all required documentation.
