Admissions Updates

Our admissions requirements regarding SAT/ACT test scores have changed for all first-year students applying for fall 2021. For students enrolling directly from high school, they must submit:

- An [Application for Admission](#) (or the Apply Idaho application for Idaho high school students)
- Non-Idaho residents only: \$60 nonrefundable application fee
- Unofficial High School transcript (can be emailed to admissions@uidaho.edu)

- ACT and/or SAT Test Scores
 - **Important:** If a student is unable to sit for the ACT/SAT exam due to COVID-19, they will automatically be considered for admission if their cumulative unweighted GPA is a 2.6 or above. If a student has below a 2.6 GPA, they can appeal through our [Admissions Committee](#).
 - If a student has a test score, they are encouraged to provide it for class placement. Test scores do not need to be sent separately if they are on school transcripts.

Reminder: Students who complete their application and submit their FAFSA by December 1 will be considered for all available scholarships. After December 1, students will be considered on a rolling basis.
