COVID-19 ADDENDUM (September 1, 2020)

The ongoing global pandemic resulted in our school moving to a virtual model. On March 13, 2020, we transitioned to a fully virtual classroom model for instruction. In compliance with local health officials, we continued with this model as we opened school for the 2020-2021 school year. Our students are instructed using a daily rotating class schedule that consists of four one-hour blocks of instruction, and assessments have been adjusted to ensure student understanding. We are maintaining our traditional grading scale and weighting of Honors and A.P. courses. Many of our co-curricular activities were cancelled in the spring of 2020 and throughout the fall of this year based on health department guidance. While we anticipate transitioning to a hybrid model of instruction sometime in the fall/winter timeframe of this year, any decisions are dependent on guidelines issued by our health department. DISTINGUISHED PROGRAMS

Benefacta Program: Benefacta encourages and recognizes extraordinary community service within and beyond the school community. Students who have completed more than fifty hours of community service may apply for the Benefacta Program.

Belldegrun Center for Innovative Leadership (BCIL): The BCIL prepares community members to engage with real world challenges and explore solutions within and beyond the classroom. The BCIL includes our Social Entrepreneurship and other courses.

Book Awards: Each year, Brentwood gives Book Awards to recognize students with the highest GPA in each grade.

Brentwood Theater Company (BTC), Brentwood Dance Company (BDC), and Madrigals (choral): BTC and BDC are advanced, audition-based ensembles open to juniors and seniors. Our advanced choral group, Madrigals, is open only to seniors.

Cum Laude: Only students in the top 20% of the senior class and in the top 10% of the junior class may be considered for admission into the Cum Laude society. Cum Laude scholars must also have consistently exhibited integrity, compassion, good judgment, and social responsibility. Twelve members of the Class of 2021 were inducted into Cum Laude as juniors.

Dean's List: Students named to the Dean's List have no effort or citizenship marks of U and a grade point average of 3.6 or higher.

Foundations of Education: This class accompanies our Civic and Educational Leadership program. Students learn about issues in education and act as peer educators, teaching assistants, and tutors. They also partner with L.A. schools to research and attempt to implement reform.

Honor Roll: Brentwood School names students to the Honor Roll who have no effort or citizenship marks of U and a grade point average for the prior semester of 3.2 to 3.59.

Independent Study: Students whose petitions are approved engage in one or two semesters of rigorous study under the direction of a faculty advisor.

Peer Leaders and Teaching Assistants: Selected after a rigorous application process, 20 Peer Leaders and 10 Teaching Assistants are trained to conduct weekly outreach session with 9th graders. By facilitating dialogue through an activity based model, Peer Leaders take a course in Applied Psychology while TA's support the Human Development course in order to guide freshman during a critical developmental phase. These seniors are engaged role models in our community.

Prefect: The student body elects five Prefects from the senior class each year. Together, they lead the upper school. Two are chosen by the Head of School to be co-Head Prefects.

Summer Study: Courses offered during the summer are an extension of our college preparatory program and fulfill graduation requirements. Some students choose to take summer classes to create other options for themselves during the school year.

The minimum requirements for graduation are:

- 3 semesters of two fine arts
- 2 years physical education
