





If you have a grown up, see how quickly you can remember the partner when they say a number to 10. Remember: If you know your bonds to 10, use this to learn your bonds to 20... what do you notice about bonds to 10 and 20 - how are they similar?</p>	<p>English – Create a poster that will help people remember to care for the environment, really thinking about habitats of minibeast.</p> <p>Remember – Posters need to be bold and bright and catch the eye. Give them important bits of information, but not too much detail. If you have more to say – write it on the back to share when you tell people about your poster.</p>		<p>PE – Have a go at moving your body in different directions and ways – try galloping, skipping, jumping, side stepping. Which movements make it easy to change direction?</p> <p>If you need a bit of quiet time, log on to Cosmic Yoga for a stretching calm session. Remember – to use your whole bodies.</p>

Learn the names of the letters and check you know their sounds too!</p> <p>Remember: Think carefully about where you need to start the letter and where you finish. Hold your pencil correctly and not too tightly. Make sure you are sat up straight at a table.</p>		<p>Art – Pencils can be used to make lots of different marks on the page and artists use pencils to add texture to their drawings. Have a look at examples of cross hatching, shading, smudging, stippling on the internet and have a go yourself. Try and recreate a butterfly and add detail using these techniques instead of colouring pencils.</p> <p>Remember – hold your pencil comfortably and the harder you press the darker your marks will be.</p>
