Treasurer's Report - Budget Report We expect the budgeted amount for the silent auction will be greatly reduced. We are currently sitting at a loss of \$950 for the year, but there are a number of items on the budget for events that won't happen. Our goal is to end the year in the black, which is great considering our biggest fundraiser was canceled. The good news of a stress free fundraiser next Fall is that it can run regardless of how school returns. We can't know how we'll budget to the individua committees until we know what next year looks like. Typically Laura would reach out to committee heads to discuss this at this time, but she hasn't been able to do that yet. If you are heading a committee, please feel free to contact Laura. We typically meet as an executive board to plan a budget and then approve it at our Fall meeting. We are still planning to do that and will get the information as soon as we can. Most of our big expenses are field trips and cultural arts. Whatever was left over in what we gave to the school this year will be added to our budget for next year. This will help offset the

With the library being done sooner than expected, how does that affect our budget? We collected money years ago for the library. We do not have numbers yet, but we should be able to cover our initial contribution that we committed to. We haven't received a bill though yet.

Committee Reports:

Variety Show - RECAP on VIRTUAL variety show and participation. Big thanks to Rachel and Theresa. We are happy that we were able to do this in a different way and were still able to have this event, although differently than usual. There were 223 views of the video during the weekend it was live.

Teacher Appreciation Week (May 4-8) Virtual - Thanks to committee & general recap of what was done. Unfortunately, we weren't able to do as much as we usually do. Each teacher was sent a \$5 Amazon card. As of now, only 30 teachers have actually received it. Cindy will follow up with to contact the teachers to work with those who haven't opened them yet.

Book Fair (ONLINE) – Scholastic shows profits as they ship, so the number is not yet accurate. It will likely take a few weeks before everything is shipped, so we won't know for a while. Scholastic shipping is a bit delayed because they are doing what they can to keep their shipping staff safe. We usually have about \$5,000 in sales at this book fair with BOGO, so we know it will be less than that. We will get 25% of sales as Scholastic dollars, which we can use however the school decides. (One of those things we use the dollars for is the birthday books for each student). Katie is having issue contacting people because her representatives are furloughed right now. Katie put in a request in March for our Fall dates but hasn't heard anything back from them yet, so dates are not yet confirmed. THANK YOU to Katie for all of your efforts!

Yearbook – Yearbook is printing! Jessica shared a sneak peak, including the Corona virus page. Sales were low, but of course they went up during the last week. There were only 15 families that didn't change their address to their home, so they will have to pick up from the district. If you forgot to update your delivery address, you can pick up at the District Admin Office during normal building hours. The yearbooks should arrive before May 29th. Watch your mailboxes. Something to look forward to. HUGE THANKS to Jessica for creating, photographing, editing and communicating all year long.

Silent Auction – This event is moving to an online format. We are using a service (32 auctions). We have to pay a fee but it's really small (about \$30). Heather sent an email that is going to be sent out to the parents either tonight or tomorrow notifying parents the event will be online and including a link to sign up for the raffle. We are still doing a raffle for the parking spot. There is also dine and dash. The first people who fill out the google form, will be randomly selected for our dine and dash gift cards. We may use a spinning wheel and do it on Facebook to determine which gift card they're going to get. The actual silent auction will hopefully launch on May 22. It will be open for one week to the 29th. Everyone will be invoiced for their total amount after that. Payment will be accepted as checks only. Items are all at Heather Wooden's. Check drop off and item pick up will be coordinated through her. Some of the items we received, we will not be able to use. We will be contacting some companies to try to extend expiration dates and figure out a way to use them. Most items don't have expiration dates. One item is a beach pass, but we don't know when that will be open.

We need classroom baskets at Heather's house by Friday to allow them time to take pictures and get everything uploaded to the auction site. Be sure to include the intake form when you drop it off.

Teacher experiences will not be able to be done this year. We are thinking about looking into doing them at Family Fun Night if that happens.

Knights of Columbus was paid a deposit for the event. Angelica spoke with them a couple of weeks ago regarding that and they are working through everything right now. The deposit is refundable so we should be getting one, but she isn't sure when. Expenses for the auction so far are the invitations, bid sheets and check out sheets, but the sheets can be used next year, so expenses are minimal.

There is an option in the google form if people want to donate but not buy anything. If anyone has anything to donate, contact Heather and drop it off by Friday.

Restaurant Nights- RECAP April- Hungry Mule & Mexican Pancake. We knew the Mexican pancake place was a risk. It was the first fundraiser they've ever done. It definitely got crazy, especially from 6-7 pm. We made \$180 and then he threw in another \$20 due to the problems. That's more than we make at many other events. There was talk about how to use the money. Because we already advertised it for the PTO, we stuck with that.

Diana contacted Fresh Stack in Kildeer (grandson of Dave Thomas, from Wendy's). They opened today.

June 1 ALL Day-Culvers. We usually make about \$300-350. This is our big one. They originally wanted to cancel it. Instead of doing it from 4-7 pm, it will be 10 am to 10 pm. They've bumped it up from 10% to 15%, but you MUST mention Sarah Adams. They are hoping not everyone comes at dinner. They know how SA turns out and they can't manage that during the drive thru alone. They are encouraging people to turn out through the day.

Diana is hoping to schedule some through the summer. It's a win-win, we support them and they support us.

Fresh Stack had so much business, they had to shut their doors for dinner today! THANK YOU, Diana. They're going great this year!

Fifth Grade Picnic canceled. This is budgeted in our PTO budget. The PTO is using those funds to surprise the kids with MSS shirts, their first piece of middle school spirit wear. We worked with Melon Ink to design the shirts. The teachers are working with Mrs. Culver to set up zoom picnic lunches with their classrooms.

Joanie's Closet- Directing parents to the district website for the food program both for need or donations. The committee met today and is still working to get school supplies. If you're interested in assisting families in need, please see the Joanie's Closet page on the district website. St. Francis and Alpine Chapel are doing a lot to help as well.

Box Tops & Coke Rewards- Keep using the online app! If you have any actual box tops or Coke tops, please put them in a plastic bag and drop them at Amanda's at 655 Pheasant Ridge and she will get them entered. Include your child's name and teacher.

After School Programs - Attempting to obtain reimbursement for families. Young Rembrandts: With the exception of 1 family, all chose to continue participating in the class online. Young Rembrandts did not hear back from 1 family and are following up again.

Sticky Fingers: They are offering our families the option to receive a partial refund or credit towards future classes. I asked them for final confirmation once they connected with all of our families.

Chess Scholars and Let's Build It are run through the same company (Afterschool Enrichment Solutions). They are refusing to offer refunds and reiterated their policy clearly states no refunds are issued for matters beyond their control. Not sure we can do anything about this?? We are not happy with their inflexibility.

If anyone is impacted by this and would like PTO assistance, please reach out to us. The lack of flexibility may be taken into account when we determine with whom we partner next year. One of the challenges in offering credits is that we have to use them again next year. We also may need flexibility next year as well. Keep in mind that if you accept a credit, it may be useless.

Made by Me Market – If you have a child who was signed up as a student vendor, you would have received an email letting you know that the event had to be canceled for all three schools. Rita really tried to find a way to make it work, especially knowing students have put out money for their crafts. It is on our calendar for next year and we will try to start over. We've encouraged student vendors to keep their product and consider participating next year. For the fifth graders, we did let them know that we are hoping to provide a program at the middle school level, for a program with a progression through high school, similar to the chamber of commerce business expo.
