3. Emergency Operations Plan
 - a. Committee were emailed the Emergency Operations Plan and also given a hard copy of the plan at the meeting to review. Mr. Kreiter discussed information included in the EOP that is a requirement from the legislative session. Mr. Kreiter explained various sections on mitigation, response and recovery, as well as responsibilities of various departments and campuses. He discussed communication and reunification systems currently in place at FISD. He also went over the role of the School Safety Advisory Committee that is also contained in the EOP. Mr. Kreiter also went over the training requirements included in the EOP for all staff and substitutes.
4. TXSSC Legislative Updates
 - a. Mr. Kreiter gave the committee an update on some of the recent legislative changes that have gone into effect.
5. Threat Assessment and Safe and Supportive Team Update
 - a. Mr. Kreiter gave the committee an update on each campus threat assessment team meetings with students this year. He explained the role of the threat assessment team and the positive impact it is having on students. Captain Lauersdorf spoke to the proactive aspect of the threat assessment team and all the staff (principal, nurse, teachers, counselors, PD) involved that work together to help students and move forward. He talked about teamwork covering the whole child by getting all the pieces to the puzzle to help students and identifying early warning signs.
6. Questions - Reports from Campuses/departments
 - a. Several staff members discussed the threat assessment team process and the positive impact it is having by helping them have a bigger picture. Helps to have a team to support students and a formalized process to move forward. Threat

Assessment teams are also available to be used for staff members at an appropriate level. Ongoing staff training and adapting to changing times was also discussed, Mr. Kreiter discussed some current ideas he is looking into for the District. There was also discussion about communication to parents regarding incidents that happen on campuses.

7. Homework: Discussion on Training and Drills, Vaping.
 - a. Mr. Kreiter discussed drills and training at secondary schools and the location of the threat. He also discussed vape detection devices as well as research on the ways around the devices.

Homework for next meeting: scenario of an incident and write a line of communication to send out and we can discuss. Also bring one safety concern and one safety idea. Mr. Kreiter will send an email with this information as a reminder prior to the next meeting on March 4.
