 - 25% felt they could get help they needed
 - 18.4% inflicted self-injury during school year
 - HW: 13.5 have considered suicide
 - LGBTQ kids: 32% seriously considered suicide
 - SEOW has an open data portal that we will need to know

 - Funding given to The Bridge for "Every Family" newsletter
 - Hoarding self-help Group now moved to virtual format due to Covid-19; currently a waiting list
 - 15 sessions, 2 hour each
 - Eliminated funding for Safe-Grad
 - Supporting Town that Cares cards handed out to emergency services and schools
 - Next application must follow goals to reduce vaping from 12-18, and increasing public awareness of substance abuse prevention
- ii. Met with Town of Bloomfield
 - Educate residents on Naloxone
 - · Met once, other meetings were cancelled due to Covid-

d. Youth Service Bureau Report, Jonathan Merritt

i. Changes in Programming due to Covid-19

Mentoring Report:

- In February, our busiest month for mentoring, we held 86 mentoring sessions serving 30 youths.
- In March, we held 60 sessions, serving 27 youths.
- In April our numbers dropped drastically; we held 49 sessions, but only served 15 youths - we were unable to reach half of our kids - schools reported having much difficulty reaching the families of these students as well.
- 32 sessions in May
- Teen Center Report:
 - Teens have been reporting talking to a lot of their friends and mental health is a general concern with regards specifically to depression and anxiety.

- Our Virtual Groups have been successful with a small cohort of teens; we currently serve about 20 teens online
- Offer the following virtual groups:
 - Movie Group (8 members) M 2:30-3:30
 - Girls Group (5 members) W 2:00-3:00
 - Leadership Group (14 members) W 3:30-4:30
 - Book Club (5 members) Th 2:30-3:30
 - Game Group (8 members) F 3-4:30
- We have been conducting bi-weekly check-ins to assess needs of teen center families; we have 65 families on the list of "teen center regulars"
- From those needs we have provided families with gift cards to grocery stores
- Summer Programming:
 - Group Mentoring for up to 6-10 youths
 - Leadership Summer Program for 6-10 youths
 - Teen Center Group Activities
 - Photography
 - Gardening club at ECC Garden Clean up and planting to commence next week
 - Biking, Fishing, other outdoor activities
 - Individual Mentoring for 8 youths
- e. WHPP Report, Presentation on work in community, Ken Plourd

 - **ii.** Age 4 highlight: Substance use trend chart looking at trends over the last 10 years
 - iii. Brochures designed by teens at teen center

 - vi. WH risk survey:
 - 23% reported drinking at least 1 in past 30 days slightly lower than national average; declined from last survey as well
 - Of this 23%, 12.2% report getting drunk at least 1 time
 - Most students who drink are drinking at home parties
 - 111 students reported drinking alone
 - No difference between drinking rates in both Hall and Conard
 - Students who identify non-binary drink significantly more
 - 4 mental health indicators discussed
