

Pick a number and write down what is 10 more and 10 less than that number</p> <p>Remember: when we count on in 10's in a 2 digit number, it is only the number in the 10's column that changes.</p>  | <p>English – Last week we made dioramas of habitats. Write a detailed description of your habitat.</p>  <p>Remember – Handwriting and presentation Capital letters and full stops. What wonderful adjectives can you use to make your description even better?</p> | | <p>PE – Using all the different body moves you have been practicing over the last few weeks, play 'Follow the leader'... can everyone in your house move like you?</p> <p>Remember – to use your whole bodies.</p>  |
| W | <p>Phonics: Phonics Play now has a free login to be used at home. What book will you choose from Bug Club today?</p> | <p>Maths: Have a go at counting up and back in 1's, 2's, 3's, 5's, 10's Write them down. What do you notice? Is there a pattern?</p> <p>Remember – decide on your pattern of counting and stick to it (always in 2's for example), you could clap or whisper the numbers inbetween. You could make yourself a 100 square to help or a number line where you can see the jumps.</p> | <p>English – Choose an insect that really interests you and find out some fascinating facts. Aim for 5 facts!</p> <p>Remember: You will need to do some research first, perhaps on the internet or in a book. Consider who will be best to present it – will it be a poster, a set of fact cards, a leaflet or fact file?</p> | | <p>Art – Have a good look around your home, what different textures can you find? Using pencils, use your mark making skills to represent the different textures you find. Remember – hold your pencil comfortably and the harder you press the darker your marks will be.</p>  |
