10 Things You Can Do to Prepare for School:





Practice Hand Hygiene often throughout the day. Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds ensuring you wash all surfaces of your hands.



Records & Physicals. Complete immunization records and current physicals are required. Contact your child's pediatrician to schedule an updated, yearly physical.



Practice Wearing a Mask. Your child will be required to wear a mask on the bus and throughout the school day. Masks breaks will be offered during the day when students can maintain proper social distancing. Practice putting on and taking off your mask the right way. See the CDC instructions for mask use/care.



Practice 6ft of Distance. Measure out the distance so you have an idea of what sufficient social distancing looks like.

Change Aerosolized Medication. Nebulizers & inhalers without a chamber cannot be administered in school. Speak with your child's pediatrician to obtain the proper equipment & to update the Asthma Action Plan.



Purchase a Reusable Water Bottle to be brought to school. Water fountains will not be in service; we will have water fill stations.






Make/Purchase Extra Masks.

All students should have 1-2 backup masks in their backpacks in the event that their mask becomes soiled. Consider making or buying multiple masks to give you proper time to wash them between use; masks should be washed daily.
