

Shepaug Valley School was completed in 1971 and designed to provide a quality education for the students of Bridgewater, Roxbury, and Washington, Connecticut and is also a school of choice for students in Sherman, Connecticut. Shepaug is a comprehensive public school grades 6-12 with an enrollment of 434 students, 284 of which are high school students, and 56 faculty members.

Commonly referred to as the Shepaug Experience, the learning community is known for rich and diverse programs, class sizes that maximize student engagement in intellectual pursuits, close relationships between teachers and students, and a reputation for excellence.



THE SHEPAUG EXPERIENCE

SVS Core Values: Our learning community challenges and inspires us to demonstrate critical thinking, ethical behavior, creativity, and compassion each day in pursuit of intellectually curious and fulfilling lives as citizens of a dynamic, multicultural America and our global society.

In order to uphold our Core Values and achieve our Learner Outcomes, Shepaug features a professionally equipped theater, an Olympic style swimming pool, and a well appointed technology and arts wing designed to introduce our students to a broad range of career, creative, and technological pursuits. The school provides state-of-the-art technology for student and teacher use. The library houses more than 12,500 print volumes, periodicals, and resource materials in a variety of media.

For the second year, Shepaug students will also have the opportunity to participate in an agriscience program, focusing on such topics as equine, animal, and plant systems; power, structural and technical systems; and food production and processing, including sustainable food production.

Covid -19: On March 13th, 2020 the school year was altered to a distance learning environment. Students were given the choice to continue with traditional grading, or to utilize a pass fail approach.

Model United Nations: Last year, students participated in the annual Model United Nations conference hosted by Harvard University. 24 students spent four days in Boston collaborating with over 3,000 students from 34 countries. 18 Shepaug students represented the country of South Africa, while 6 served a highly competitive, specialized committees. In addition to General Assembly committees, several Shepaug students were accepted to highly competitive specialized committees.

Shepaug Dramatics: Students earned 12 nominations for the prestigious Halo Awards. Two students took home distinguished awards for Best Original Program Cover Design and Best Performance By a Leading Actor for *Little Shop of Horrors*.

SYNCHRONOUS LEARNING

ZOOM AND GOOGLE HANGOUTS

New learning occurred virtually through Google Hangouts and Zoom platforms. Shepaug teachers were innovative in their approaches to delve into new topics!

27-MINUTE CLASSES MONDAY-THURSDAY

Students were expected to attend virtually Monday-Thursday for just under a half an hour. Student's in need of assistance took advantage of extra help before school or on Friday

FLEXIBLE GRADING

PASS WITH DISTINCTION/PASS/FAIL

Shepaug acknowledges that online learning is not the best format to learn for all students. In an effort to be fair with our grading system. Shepaug allowed for students to opt-in to the Pass with Distinction/Pass/Fail system instead of our traditional grading for the second semester. Students who elected this option who received a 90% or higher, received the "Pass with Distinction" honor.

Shepaug Valley students created a social media page to keep students, staff, families, and community members engaged and connected during a time of uncertainty. Each day there was a new challenge.
