1. All community council members and observers were introduced.
2. Review of policies, points of order, making motions, etc.
3. David Stringfellow and Paulynn Hacking were selected as nominees for the chair position. A motion was made to elect to vote in the chair. Paulynn Hacking received 6 votes and was selected as the chair for the 2021 school year.
4. Report on school opening – Students have been doing a great job of maintaining social distancing and wearing masks. Parents have had a difficult time wearing masks at extracurricular activities. The school's biggest concern is focusing on AP and CE courses and making sure that all students have the level of support they need to be successful. As the school transitions to 4 days a week, FHS will maintain as many of the policies as possible. Positive cases of Covid are reported to the school by the health department and the school takes appropriate measures. Covid TA's are used to help tracking. A motion was made to have the community council to inform the public if FHS if over 15 active cases. A second motion was made. This motion was voted down. This item was tabled until next meeting. Principal Swanson will find out more information on the possibility of informing the public regarding Covid related numbers without disclosing confidential information.
5. Information was given regarding the SIP and budget from the previous year. A discussion was held regarding technology funding and how classes and teachers are funded.
6. ACT scores were excellent from last year. Test prep services will continue for the 2021 school year.
7. Dances are currently suspended. FHS will look for guidance from the district on when dances can return.
8. October 5<sup>th</sup>, students will return to 4 days per week.
9. Fridays are the deep cleaning day. Teachers are contacting student virtually. Times are designated for each subject area where teachers can hold review sessions, tutor individual students, etc.
