
Guidelines on campus: Hand Washing

- Hand Sanitizing before drop off
 - Hand sanitizing before entering and when leaving the room
- Hand sanitizing/ washing before eating
- One restroom/toilet stall per cohort, hand sanitizing/ washing before and after use
- Hand sanitizing/ washing before recess



Guidelines on campus: Ventilation

- New windows will be open throughout the day with doors open as well to create circulation
- Each classroom is equipped with an air filter
- Most meals will also be outside
- Teachers will have some instructions outdoors

Middle School

- Grade 5-6 = cohort, grade 7-8 = cohort,
- Students at home belong to their homerooms and attend their classroom via google meet (bidirectional)
- Teachers don't belong to any cohort (are isolated from students)
- All lessons are taught in the designated homeroom classrooms
- three double hours a day at 100-minute blocks
- after an extended break for the drive home and lunch break, some additional lessons online, mainly as free work with the support of subject teachers
- **new schedule** after the fall break
- no PE
- no homework policy remains in place
- All students need to have access to a printer with ink and paper



German/DaZ and English/ESL

- Online: DaZ/ESL-teacher can work separately with students
 - weekly lessons dedicated to language acquisition (Sprachstunde)
 - Same as during DL
- On-campus: DaZ/ESL-teacher may work separately with students outside the classrooms
- Alternative: online-support
 - e.g. Professional assessment, individualized support, Testing accommodations,
 Specialized error monitoring



Exams

- Complex assignments (e.g. open book exams) will continue in most subjects
- written exams are possible in main subjects (2nd quarter)
- students that do not attend classes on campus can come to campus to take exams or can take exams online at home
- Students who don't attend the campus for the exam, need a printer with ink and paper, a camera which works, good internet and a signed consent form from parents and student and a room for themselves
