



This Thursday, October 15, we celebrate the feast day of one of my favorite saints! We honor St. Teresa of Jesus (of Avila.) She lived from 1515-1582. St. Teresa was very instrumental in bringing reform to the Carmelite order with the assistance of St. John of the Cross

From the PAULpit



The story of Martha and Mary is one that we are familiar with - Martha doing all the work while Mary sits and listens to Jesus. We often wish we could be more like Mary, that is, less busy, more prayerful, still, and at peace. At times, however, when we do find ourselves less

busy with more time for prayer and discernment we find ourselves getting restless. That small little whisper of a voice that God uses to speak to us starts to poke at us about this or that. God's message to us can be challenging and difficult. Some of us can feel unproductive or lazy if we take more than a moment or two out of our day to pray. We are so accustomed to being on the move that stopping everything to pray for more than a moment would cause us to be anxious. When we spend time like Martha, we wish we could be more like Mary. When we spend time like Mary, we wish we could be more like Martha.

Between these two saints, we recognize the need for balance and complementarity. We cannot spend all of our time praying and we cannot spend all of our time working. We need to pray to unite our hearts to the Lord. Doing so will cause our work to be even more productive. We need to work to sustain our livelihoods and that of others.

Prayer and work are not at odds with each other! St. Paul told the Thessalonians to pray ceaselessly. Prayer can take many different forms. Our work can become a prayer when we intentionally do it for the glory of God and love for others. Prayer does not only have to be a thing that is quiet and alone - it can happen anywhere. Even things that we do that seem mundane can be turned into a prayer. Cutting the grass - prayer. Making dinner - prayer. Your job - prayer. God can be found in all things and all things can be done for Him.

Dear parishioners - It is with joy in our hearts that we share Divine Child resumed public Masses on Tuesday, May 19, 2020. In alignment with the liturgical directives issued by Archbishop Allen Vigneron, we are committed to providing a safe and clean environment for the faithful to worship our Lord. The health of our parishioners is of utmost importance to us and new procedures and protocols have been put in place to ensure this. Please review the information below regarding how Mass will work and the role we all play in keeping each other safe. Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we work through our new "normal" together. Note: Dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is granted to all faithful until Monday, Nov. 23, 2020. Let us keep each other in our prayers. - Fr. Bob McCabe

SECTION 1: WHO SHOULD ATTEND MASS

There is no age restriction for attending in-person Mass. It is up to each individual to decide what is best for them based on his or her particular circumstances. All are welcome! Space is limited and we cannot exceed 375 parishioners in the church at one time. This means we must count the number of attendees at each Mass, and we must turn attendees away when we reach capacity. We believe all people who desire to worship our Lord should have the ability to do so. See Section 2 for how we are working to ensure all can worship

INDOOR MASSES | We are returning to our normal weekday and weekend Mass schedule. All parishioners must enter the church through the front doors (Silvery Lane). Only 375 people will be admitted at once, and an attendant will be keeping count at the door. Attendees beyond that will be asked to proceed to the corresponding outdoor Mass at 10:15 AM or 12:45 PM, or to watch the weekend's streamed Mass.

OUTDOOR MASSES | Weather permitting, we added two outdoor Sunday Masses at 10:15AM & 12:45PM on the football field. Attendees may enter the football field through the gateway building, through the North-West gate from the elementary school lot, or through the South-East gate. Attendees will be seated on the field facing the home bleachers. Those who attend the outdoor Masses are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand -held umbrella for shade. Don't forget your sunscreen! Face-coverings are not required at outdoor Masses as long as social distancing is maintained. *Note: Outdoor Mass cancellations due to weather will be communicated to parishioners by 7AM via text, social media and email.

LIVE STREAMED MASS | For those unable to attend Mass in- person, the weekend live stream will continue, but it will be released Sunday at 10 AM. Look for a link to the Mass on the parish website.

SECTION 3: HOW MASS WILL WORK

FINDING A SEAT | To ensure proper social distancing and sanitizing of pews. parishioners will be asked to adhere to a seating chart for each Mass. Pews will be marked with alternating color coded letters. Please sit in these colored/lettered pews for the following Mass times. Attendants will also be present to assist parishioners.

SATURDAY MASSES:

8:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 4:30 PM - Yellow/B pews only

12:30 PM - Orange/A pews only

CONFESSIONS AVAILABLE Private confessions are held every Saturday from 2:30-4 PM and after the 4:30 PM Vigil Mass. All confessions are heard inside the church confessionals

OUTDOOR MASSES:

Please sit on or near the ten yard lines in order to provide adequate social distancing. Orange cones will be placed along each ten yard line to mark the amount of space to the front and back of attendees. <u>Those</u> who attend the outdoor Mass are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a handheld umbrella for shade. Face-coverings are not required at outdoor Masses as long as social distancing is maintained.

OFFERTORY | There will not be a collection during Mass. Upon the conclusion of Mass, please place your offertory in the collection baskets located in front of the altar, in the Gathering Space or at any exit of the football field. Alternatively, donations can be made online through FaithDirect.net, or mailed to/dropped off at the rectory (1055 N. Silvery Lane, Dearborn, MI 48128).

COMMUNION | A limited number of Eucharistic ministers will be on hand for each Mass to distribute Communion to multiple pew banks/yard lines. Thank you in advance for your patience as we expect Communion to take longer than usual. Communion procedures will be explained just before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to receive the Eucharist, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Attendees should maintain 6 feet of distance from other attendees while proceeding to the front of church/field.
- All attendees should remove masks and gloves as they approach the minister. No gloves may be worn when receiving the Eucharist in hand.
- Attendees should bow and reply "Amen" at a distance of 6 feet from the Eucharistic minister and then approach to receive the Eucharist.

For your safety, if a Eucharistic minister accidentally touches the hand or mouth of a parishioner, he or she will sanitize his or her hands instantly with rubbing alcohol at a sanitizing station located near each Eucharistic minister's station

*If you are uncomfortable receiving the Eucharist at this time, please know that there is no obligation to receive the Eucharist whenever you come to Mass.


This event is for 8th - 12th graders, their parents and siblings.

GOSPEL

Matthew 22:1-14 or 22:1-10

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who have a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast." Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Praying with the Mass Readings

Spiritual reading of Sacred Scripture is a form of prayer called **lectio divina**.

- 1. Begin... Come, Holy Spirit
- Read (lectio): Read the Mass Bible passage. Read it carefully, two or three times. Let it really soak in. Underline a word or sentence that stands out to you.
- 3. Meditation (meditatio). Ponder the words of the passage that stood out to you. Allow yourself to be moved by the Word of God to discover its meaning for your life.
- 4. Prayer (oratio). Speak to God about the passage. Be yourself. Allow time for silence to let God speak back to you. In this prayerful engagement with the Bible passage, you open yourself up to the possibility of contemplation.
- 5. Contemplation (contemplatio): Resting in silence ask, "God, show me the way."

Hispanic Saint of the Week: Saint Juan Diego

A beautiful picture of Mary can be seen on a cloak above the main altar in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico

City. The cloak belonged to Juan Diego, an Aztec who lived more than 450 years ago.

On December 9, 1531, when Juan was walking to Mass, a beautiful lady dressed as an Aztec appeared. She told him she was the Immaculate Virgin Mary, the Mother of the true God. She desired to have a shrine there at Tepeyac Hill. Mary asked Juan to tell the bishop of her desire. The bishop didn't believe him, so Juan returned to the lady and suggested she send a better speaker. Mary told Juan that she chose him for this work and that she would bless him for helping her. Juan revisited the bishop. This time the bishop told him to ask his lady for a sign that she was the Mother of God. When Juan did, Mary told him to return the next day for a sign.

The same day Juan's Uncle Bernardino became ill, and Juan stayed home to care for him. When his uncle was dying, Juan went for a priest. On the way he met the Holy Virgin. He apologized for not meeting her the day before. Mary replied, "Now listen to me. Do not let anything bother you, and do not be afraid of any illness, pain, or accident. Am I not here, your Mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? What more could you want? Don't worry about your uncle. He is well already."

Mary then sent Juan to the top of the hill to gather the flowers growing there. Juan found gorgeous roses! He picked them and brought them to Mary, who told Juan to take them to the bishop.

When the bishop saw Juan, he asked what he had in his tilma. Juan opened it, letting the roses fall. On Juan's cloak a beautiful, life-size image began to appear. Juan gasped. It was his Lady! The bishop cried out, "The Immaculate!" Then he knelt and with tears asked the Blessed Mother's pardon for not believing Juan.

On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him.

Juan Diego remained poor, simple, humble, and devoted to the Eucharist. Juan Diego was beatified in 1990 and canonized in 2002.



On September 20, 2020, Monsignor Charles Kosanke, rector of the Basilica of Ste. Anne de Detroit, announced that Archbishop Allen Vigneron has granted the parish permission to establish a guild that will study the life and materials of Father Richard. This study will determine if there is sufficient evidence to recommend to Archbishop Vigneron that an official cause for the canonization of Father Richard be opened.

Father Gabriel Richard was a zealous pastor whose missionary heart guided all that he did. At a time when we in the Archdiocese are coming to a renewed awareness of our missionary vocation, I am grateful that we are able to raise up Father Richard as a model and inspiration for our mission today.

ABOUT FATHER GABRIEL RICHARD

Born in France, Fr. Richard escaped the guillotine during the French Revolution and came to United States in 1792. He arrived in Detroit in 1798 as pastor at Ste. Anne de Detroit. During the great fire of 1805, when the entire settlement was destroyed, Fr. Richard proclaimed a legendary phrase that would go on to become the motto of the city of Detroit:

SPERAMUS MELIORA RESURGET CINERIBUS "We hope for better things. It will rise again from the ashes."

Fr. Richard brought the first printing press to the city and founded the city's first newspaper. He co-founded the University of Michigan in 1817.

Preached the Gospel to all - including to Protestant congregations and Native Americans.

Fr. Richard died while ministering day and night to the sick during a cholera epidemic.






FUN FACTS:

RECIPE OF THE WEEK: Chicken Paella

While this classic Spanish dish originated as an ordinary work lunch for farmers, this version is far from ordinary. It's a great way to honor St. Teresa of Avila, who was born in Spain.

- 4 bone-in chicken thighs
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 small onion diced
- 1 garlic clove minced
- 4 tablespoons hot water
- 1 teaspoon saffron
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 2 cups arborio rice
- 3 cups chicken stock
- 1 can pigeon peas



Mix it all together. Turn heat to high and allow rice to begin to boil. Turn heat to the lowest setting. Add the chicken pieces to the pan. Cover the pan tightly with foil and allow to cook on the stove top for 30 minutes. Remove foil and check to see if chicken is cooked through. Serve family style so everyone can enjoy it.

Meet Our Extended Family: St. Teresa of Ávila (Feast Day October 15) March 28, 1515 – October 4, 1582

St. Teresa was born in central Spain, amidst that country's greatest century. She was from a large, middle-class and pious family. As a girl, Teresa dreamed of being a martyr or a hermit. As a woman, Teresa stood on her own two feet, even in the man's world of her time. She lived what she demanded of others, and she did it all with a cheerful disposition and a rich personality that overcame deep-seated opposition. She was a mystic, writer, and reformer of the Carmelite order. She was an influential and pivotal figure of her generation. Teresa was the first female non-martyr to have her feast day extended to the universal Church, and, due to the profundity of her mystical writings, she was declared a Doctor of the Church by Paul VI in 1970.

- Why does Jesus use the image of a wedding feast to describe the kingdom of heaven?
