Florida Inclusion Network (FIN) Reports LRE Improvements!

(Least Restrictive Environment)

The LRE percentages have greatly improved in the FDLRS Heartland service area, with Glades County improving and earning the most allotted points. Way to go Glades! The State's goals are for students with disabilities to be included in the general education setting for at least 80% of their school day. [The State does recognize that this practice is not appropriate for every student with disabilities and had given the schools and districts five years to improve to the 2018-2019 school year's goal represented in the following chart.] Almost 50% of the Heartland schools have accomplished these goals but there is still improvement to be had in every school district.

Regular Classroom (>80% of the school day) 85% of total ESE population

Special Ed Setting (<40% of the day in Gen Ed) <6% of total ESE population

Separate Setting (home-school, hospital/homebound...) <1% of total ESE

One of the areas that districts have improved in is the coding and way that they report their LRE percentages. Schools who have taken advantage of FIN's Inclusive Scheduling process have developed Master Schedules that support Collaborative Teaching and Planning and ensure that students with disabilities are receiving their prescribed specially designed instruction by qualified teachers.

Look for additional training opportunities from FIN throughout this school year in the areas of: Collaborative Teaching, Specially Designed Instruction, and Disability Awareness.

GIFTED ADD-ON ENDORSEMENT COURSES

The older Gifted Add-On Endorsement courses, formerly from the state, have been undergoing updates throughout the summer months and should be DOE approved for use within the first half of this 2019-20 school year. When these courses are approved and given to FDLRS, they will be sent to all the districts to get approval and then placed in the district's master in-service plan, so that when district employees take a course they can receive credit for it.

Once all of this is in place, we will be advertising for our first gifted add-on endorsement course offered through Moodle (an on-line program for presenting information).

REFERRED TO THE DISTRICTS FOR FURTHER EVALUATIONS. A WHOPPING 94% OF THOSE KIDDOS

Active Parenting

This is a series of 3, 2 hour classes that teach parents a positive behavior management system to use with their children. Parents will be provided books and will be required to complete homework assignments. Course completers will receive a certificate. Class takes 3 weeks, 2 hour meetings each week. (6 Hours).

Test Anxiety and Homework Tips for Parents

With all the pressures of state mandated testing can be overwhelming for students. This class gives parents tips and suggestions for helping their children by using coping strategies, getting organized, and managing their homework. (1 Hour)

Understanding the IEP

This class is designed for parents who have children with an IEP. Each section of the IEP is explained. A worksheet is given to help the parents prepare for their child's next meeting. (2 Hours)

Parent Engagement in the Educational Process – Parents are given a resource that contains useful tools and handouts for keeping documentation organized. The resource will progress throughout the child's school career. (2 Hours)

WHAT IS FDLRS?



No, we don't play in a band and we aren't crabby....at least most of the time we aren't!! We are Florida Diagnostic Learning & Resources System (<u>FDLRS</u>- pronounced "fiddlers") Heartland.

Throughout every year, we always have quite a few teachers and/or administrators say they don't know what FDLRS is or what we do; so, with that in mind, we wanted to "refresh" or "introduce" exactly who we are and what we do!

There are 19 FDLRS centers throughout the state, funded through the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) dollars. FDLRS Heartland serves DeSoto, Glades, Hendry and Highlands Counties. Each center is under the Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services (BEESS) and has four functions:

- Child Find: FDLRS Child Find in coordination with the school districts, locates children aged 3-5, who are not currently in public schools, who are potentially eligible for services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and links them with needed services. Child Find services help to promote general public awareness of programs and services available for young children who have or are at risk of developing disabilities. Service coordination for diagnostic screening, placement, training, and support is also provided.
- Parent Services: FDLRS Parent Services provides information, training, and support to districts and families, in order to promote effective parent participation in the education of children who are exceptional and/or have special needs. Parent Services include assistance in the development of family friendly programs, training and support for services for children with disabilities, and the support of partnerships between schools and parents to support student achievement.
- Human Resource Development: FDLRS Human Resources Development (HRD) personnel provide professional learning opportunities to educators focused on refining teacher practices and increasing student achievement. Professional learning events are aligned to Florida's Professional Development Protocol Evaluation. FDLRS HRD Specialists support educators in their study of effective learning and teaching practices by providing needs assessments, content and or skill-based workshops, facilitating local learning communities, implementation/coaching sessions and provide follow-up support. The professional learning activities are offered in face-to-face and virtual settings as well as at a variety of training levels including awareness, in-depth, skill development and implementation.
- Technology: FDLRS provides assistance and support in the appropriate use of a variety of technologies for students, teachers, professional staff, and parents. Support services are available in the areas of assistive technology, instructional technology, Universal Design for Learning (UDL), AIM/NIMAS Florida services, and virtual/online instruction. In addition to Technology Specialists at all 19 local FDLRS Associate Centers, statewide services for students who are deaf & hard of hearing (RMTC) and statewide services for students who are blind or visually impaired (FIMC-VI) are offered by FDLRS.




