SCHOOL

The Anglo-American School of Moscow (AAS) is a non-selective, independent, non-profit, co-educational day school founded in 1949 in the Soviet Union by the Embassies of Canada, the United Kingdom, and the United States. The language of instruction is English.

AAS calculates GPA on a 4.0 weighted scale based on Gr. 11 marks. AAS does not rank individual students but reports deciles. The above decile breakdown includes all 72 students from the Class of 2021 who were enrolled at AAS during 11th Grade.

COVID-19 STATEMENT

Due to COVID-19, AAS transitioned to Distance Learning on March 23 - May 1, 2020; followed by 6 weeks of Independent Learning Extensions. School year 2020-21 began on August 24 in Distance Learning format and will transition between Hybrid and Distance Learning for the remainder of the year. Grading and assessment policies remain the same. Student access to the SAT has been extremely limited due to test center closures, therefore Class of 2021 scores are not reported above.

MISSION STATEMENT

ENROLLMENT

Approximately 893 students from more than 60 countries are currently enrolled in grades Pre-Kindergarten through 12 (ages 4-18). There are 72 students in the Class of 2021.

ACCREDITATION

The school is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. The school is also approved by the International Baccalaureate Organization for the Diploma Programme and the Primary Years Programme. In addition, AAS is a member of National Association of Independent Schools and the Central and Eastern European Schools Association.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA

At AAS, the IB Diploma Programme is the primary curriculum in Grades 11 and 12. Enrollment in the IB Programme is open to all AAS students. Students who choose to pursue the IB Diploma concurrent with the Anglo-American High School Diploma, must fulfill the following requirements:

- Enroll in 3 Higher Level courses and 3 Standard Level courses, and achieve a score of at least 24 points overall. Each course is worth a possible 7 points; points are accumulated based on internal assessments completed throughout the two years of study, as well as final IB examinations;
- Successfully complete Theory of Knowledge, the IB course in critical thinking;
- Successfully complete a 4000-word Extended Essay on a topic of their choice;
- Complete extra-curricular activities through Creativity, Action, and Service (CAS).

CHANGE IN GRADING POLICY

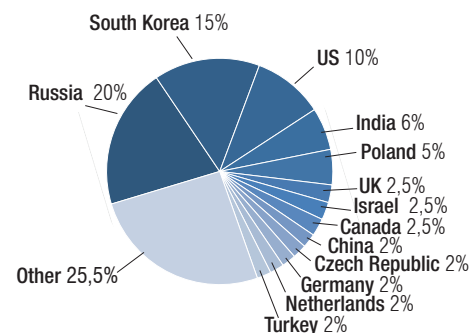
AAS moved to Standards Based Grading and Reporting (SBGR) for Grades 9 and 10 for the 2019-20 school year. Students will receive feedback using the scale: Beyond Meeting, Meeting, Approaching, Not Meeting. Students earn credit for classes in which they receive a Beyond Meeting, Meeting or Approaching designation. On the transcript these designations are converted to a 1-7 scale. In school year 2020-21, grades 9-11 will receive transcript marks on the 1-7 scale, and in school year 2021-22 grades 9-12 will receive transcript marks on the 1-7 scale. At that point, AAS will no longer report GPA or deciles for students.
