Dear Eastern Carver County Families:

Welcome to the 2022-23 school year! We are excited to serve your student(s) and do our best to set them up for learning success by providing them nutritious and delicious school meals. Please take a few minutes to review the information provided in this packet.

Meal Prices:

UPDATE: The temporary federal meal waivers that granted access to free meals for all students the last two years have now expired. Students that do not qualify for educational benefits (free or reduced priced meals) will be charged for meals.

Breakfast

- Kindergarten: Free breakfast and free milk for all kindergarteners during snack due to MN State statute
- Grades 1-12: \$1.70

Lunch

- Preschool – Grade 5: \$2.65
- Grades 6-8: \$2.85
- Grades 9+: \$3.05

A la carte items are available to purchase in our elementary, middle and high schools. Students who wish to purchase a la carte items must have a positive balance in their meal account.

Educational Benefits (Free and reduced priced meals):

Your student may qualify for educational benefits (free and reduce priced meals). In addition to qualifying students for free meals, this may also grant your student access to reduced or waived technology fees, athletics and activity fees, Community Education class fees, and discounted rates through many community businesses and organizations.

Educational benefit data also qualifies our school district for additional state funding that is critical to support the needs of students who do not meet performance standards for their grade level.

To ensure that we have your application for educational (meal) benefits processed for the start of the school year, please return the attached form by August 26th or apply online at lunchapp.112online.org. You can also submit a new application anytime during the school year as your income or number of dependents changes.

Student Meal Accounts:

Each student has an individual Nutrition Services account that requires individual payments. There are many ways to make a payment to your student's Nutrition Services account.

- **Checks** can be sent with your student to school and given to either the cashier or the school office. Please make checks payable to District 112 Nutrition Services and write your student's name, grade and school on the memo line.
- **Cash payments** can be sent with your student to school in an envelope and given to either the cashier or the school office. Please write your student's name, grade, and school on the envelope.

- Many banks offer **free bill pay service**. This gives you the ability to have your bank send funds directly to Nutrition Services to be placed in to your student's account. In the "recipient" field, enter 112 Nutrition, 11 Peavey Rd, Chaska MN, 55318. Put the name of your student in the note section. You can choose a one-time payment or set up a recurring one. Please contact your bank for more details.
- **Online payments** can be made with credit/debit cards or your checking account debit. To access this service, visit www.mypaymentsplus.com/welcome. If you have not previously set up an account with *MyPaymentsPlus*, you must do so prior to making a payment. To set up an account, you will need your child's student ID number. There is no charge for using *MyPaymentsPlus* to look up your student's balance or meal purchase history. However, *there is a 3.99% transaction fee per deposit* to use the online payment system. You can also download an app for MyPaymentsPlus in the Apple iTunes store by searching "*MyPaymentsPlus*". If you have any questions regarding accessing this system, please call Julie Eklund at 952-556-6152, or *MyPaymentsPlus* support at 1-877-237-0946.
- *Payments can be made via telephone* with a credit/debit card or checking account debit by calling 1-866-524-3542 and then following the prompts. There is a 3.99% fee per transaction to use the telephone payment system and you will need your student's ID number.

To ensure that your student's account is ready for the first day of school, please submit payments online, drop them off during the open house at your student's school, or mail them to their school (Attn: Nutrition Services), by August 26th.

Students receive and purchase items through Nutrition Services using their student ID number. If your student is a returning District 112 student and does not already know their student ID number, it can be found on the Infinite Campus parent portal. If your student is new to the district, you can obtain your student's ID number at your school's open house/orientation or by calling the 112 Nutrition office at 952-556-6145.

Special Diets:

If you are requesting any special dietary accommodations for your student for the 2022-2023 school year, please have your licensed physician, physician's assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse (e.g. certified nurse practitioner) complete a Special Diet Statement form. We request that these forms be updated each school year and/or whenever the student's diagnosis or special diet changes. Please make sure that your student's form is sent back to our office no later than August 19th to ensure accommodations can be made for the beginning of the school year. We will contact you to discuss your student's needs once our office receives your student's Special Diet Form.
