



The Big Picture With Fr. Bob

Dear Friends,

This is a great week in the life of the Today, we celebrate World On Thursday, we Mission Sunday. celebrate the feast day of St. John Paul II! Tomorrow, we remember and honor Saint John de Brebeuf and Isaac Jogues and Companions. They were missionaries that were martyrs for the Faith.

In the lives of the people mentioned above, there was a passion to make Christ known and loved by all. Each had a profound faith and love for Christ which gave them the strength to live selfless and courageous lives.

I have always had a great respect for missionaries. I am inspired whenever I hear of men and women who are willing to leave all behind so as to become missionaries. In nearly all cases, they embrace a spirit of abandonment and a spirit of detachment. They leave family and friends and so often even leave behind the country of their birth in order to bring Christ to other cultures. Such sacrifices always stir up in me a sense of awe! Throughout the centuries, missionaries have understood that they may ultimately lay down their life for the sake of bringing the Gospel to people in foreign lands.

This is the image that first comes to mind when I think of missionaries. Obviously, it is important that we keep generous and courageous missionaries in our prayers at all times!

However, there is another kind of missionary work that includes each and every Catholic! Remember, Pope Francis is calling all of us to be a "band of joyful missionary disciples." Together, we are being sent on mission!

When I was preparing to be ordained a priest 25 years ago, I had a prayer card made. I chose one of my favorite quotes by Pope John Paul II. It really reflects his own commitment to living a missionary life. Looking at his amazing missionary zeal, it is clear he practiced what he preached, he led by example. This is what he wrote: "It is not enough to discover Christ - you must bring Him to others! The world today is one great mission land, even in countries of long-standing Christian tradition."

That means our homes, our neighborhoods, our schools, our workplaces, and every place is mission territory! We may not need to learn a new language and venture out to a foreign land. We simply need to choose wisely the words we use so as to bring the light, love and healing power of God to others.

In last week's article, I shared a number of quotes form St. Teresa of Avila. One of the quotes stated, "Trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be." May we each trust that we are exactly where the Lord would have us be in order to serve as His joyful missionary disciples. This is our missionary territory! This is where the Lord wants us to "get our hands dirty" working to bring others closer to Christ.

So many people slowly drift away from the Lord. We are all in danger of becoming lukewarm if we are not continually seeking the Lord. May we pray the simple prayer, "Come, Holy Spirit." It is a simple prayer but a very powerful prayer. May the Holy Spirit fill each of us with joyful, humble, and courageous missionary zeal!

May we all, whether we are 9 or 90 years old, be the missionaries Jesus is longing us to be. Be not afraid! In simple ways, everyday we can bring someone closer to Jesus. It is one of the greatest privileges we have in life. Let's not let this great opportunity pass us by. Together, we can do this! Come, Holy Spirit!

Bird's Eye View with Fr. Pellican



Throughout his pontificate, St. John Paul II had a deep devotion to the Blessed Mother. He took for his motto the phrase, "totus tuus," short for "Totally yours, Mary." This devotion began as a child, when he lost his own mother at

the age of eight. When his father shared the news with him, he went to the Church and told the Blessed Mother: "you are my mother now." He and his father would often make pilgrimages to the nearby shrine of Kalwaria Zebrzydowska, particularly on the feast of the Assumption, and young Karol Wojtyła wore a scapular from the time he was ten on.

Mary continued to be a significant part of his life into his later years as well. When elected pope in 1978 and asked if he accepted, he replied: "In the obedience of faith before Christ my Lord, abandoning myself to the Mother of Christ and the church, and conscious of the great difficulties, I accept." He had an "M" for Mary placed on his papal coat of arms below the arm of the cross, symbolizing how Mary, the faithful mother and disciple, stood at the foot of the cross. On May 13, 1981, the pope was shot four times, twice in the lower intestine. He miraculously survived, and attributed his cure to Our Lady. After recovering, he visited Fatima and left the bullet in the crown of the blessed Mother's statue there, thanking her for guiding the bullet so that none of his inner organs were damaged.

Pope John Paul had a deep and beautiful devotion to the Blessed Mother, and she has been on my mind a lot lately as well. When I told my Pastor I thought the Lord was calling me to be a priest, he sat down with me and taught me how to pray (not just say) the Rosary. He explained it as a time to meditate on the different events of Jesus' life along with Mary, and told me: "stay close to the blessed Mother. She is the virgin most pure, and will keep you pure. She is the handmaid of the Lord, and will keep you free from doctrinal error." I share his wise words with each of you today in hopes that it will inspire you to walk with our Blessed Mother each day as St. John Paul did.



PHASE 1: A PLAN FOR Safely RETURNING TO MASS

Dear parishioners - It is with joy in our hearts that we share Divine Child resumed public Masses on Tuesday, May 19, 2020. In alignment with the liturgical directives issued by Archbishop Allen Vigneron, we are committed to providing a safe and clean environment for the faithful to worship our Lord. The health of our parishioners is of utmost importance to us and new procedures and protocols have been put in place to ensure this. Please review the information below regarding how Mass will work and the role we all play in keeping each other safe. Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we work through our new "normal" together. Note: Dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is granted to all faithful until Monday, Nov. 23, 2020. Let us keep each other in our prayers. - Fr. Bob McCabe

SECTION 1: WHO SHOULD ATTEND MASS

There is no age restriction for attending in-person Mass. It is up to each individual to decide what is best for them based on his or her particular circumstances. All are welcome! Space is limited and we cannot exceed 375 parishioners in the church at one time. This means we must count the number of attendees at each Mass, and we must turn attendees away when we reach capacity. We believe all people who desire to worship our Lord should have the ability to do so. See Section 2 for how we are working to ensure all can worship

SECTION 2: SCHEDULE OF MASSES

SIGN UP FOR TEXT ALERTS!

To receive real-time text messages regarding when the church reaches its maximum capacity and cancellations of outdoor Masses due to weather, simply text the keyword DivineChild to 845

INDOOR MASSES | We are returning to our normal weekday and weekend Mass schedule. All parishioners must enter the church through the front doors (Silvery Lane). Only 375 people will be admitted at once, and an attendant will be keeping count at the door. Attendees beyond that will be asked to proceed to the corresponding outdoor Mass at 10:15 AM or 12:45 PM, or to watch the weekend's streamed Mass.

OUTDOOR MASSES | Weather permitting, we added two outdoor Sunday Masses at 10:15AM & 12:45PM on the football field. Attendees may enter the football field through the gateway building, through the North-West gate from the elementary school lot, or through the South-East gate. Attendees will be seated on the field facing the home bleachers. Those who attend the outdoor Masses are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand -held umbrella for shade. Don't forget your sunscreen! Face-coverings are not required at outdoor Masses as long as social distancing is maintained. *Note: Outdoor Mass cancellations due to weather will be communicated to parishioners by 7AM via text, social media and email.

LIVE STREAMED MASS | For those unable to attend Mass in- person, the weekend live stream will continue, but it will be released Sunday at 10 AM. Look for a link to the Mass on the parish website. Visit www.churchofthedivinechild.org/live-masses.

SECTION 3: HOW MASS WILL WORK

FINDING A SEAT | To ensure proper social distancing and sanitizing of pews, parishioners will be asked to adhere to a seating chart for each Mass. Pews will be marked with alternating color coded letters. Please sit in these colored/lettered pews for the following Mass times. Attendants will also be present to assist parishioners.

WEEKDAY MASSES:

6:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 8:30 AM - Yellow/B pews only

A plasma generator has been installed on the church HVAC system. The device breaks down and

destroys viruses, bacteria and mold by charging the air with positive & negative ions.

SATURDAY MASSES:

8:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 4:30 PM - Yellow/B pews only

SUNDAY MASSES (Note changes): 8 AM - Orange/A pews only 10 AM - Yellow/B pews only 12:30 PM - Orange/A pews only

CONFESSIONS AVAILABLE Private confessions are held every Saturday from 2:30-4 PM and after the 4:30 PM Vigil Mass. All confessions are heard inside the church confessionals

OUTDOOR MASSES:

Please sit on or near the ten yard lines in order to provide adequate social distancing. Orange cones will be placed along each ten yard line to mark the amount of space to the front and back of attendees. <u>Those</u> who attend the outdoor Mass are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a handheld umbrella for shade. Face-coverings are not required at outdoor Masses as long as social distancing is maintained.

OFFERTORY | There will not be a collection during Mass. Upon the conclusion of Mass, please place your offertory in the collection baskets located in front of the altar, in the Gathering Space or at any exit of the football field. Alternatively, donations can be made online through FaithDirect.net, or mailed to/dropped off at the rectory (1055 N. Silvery Lane, Dearborn, MI 48128).

COMMUNION | A limited number of Eucharistic ministers will be on hand for each Mass to distribute Communion to multiple pew banks/yard lines. Thank you in advance for your patience as we expect Communion to take longer than usual. Communion procedures will be explained just before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to receive the Eucharist, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Attendees should maintain 6 feet of distance from other attendees while proceeding to the front of church/field.
- All attendees should remove masks and gloves as they approach the minister. No gloves may be worn when receiving the Eucharist in hand.
- Attendees should bow and reply "Amen" at a distance of 6 feet from the Eucharistic minister and then approach to receive the Eucharist.

For your safety, if a Eucharistic minister accidentally touches the hand or mouth of a parishioner, he or she will sanitize his or her hands instantly with rubbing alcohol at a sanitizing station located near each Eucharistic minister's station

*If you are uncomfortable receiving the Eucharist at this time, please know that there is no obligation to receive the Eucharist whenever you come to Mass.

Spiritual reading of Sacred Scripture is a form of prayer called **lectio divina**.

- 1. Begin... Come, Holy Spirit
- 2. Read (lectio): Read the Mass Bible passage. Read it carefully, two or three times. Let it really soak in. Underline a word or sentence that stands out to you.
- 3. Meditation (meditatio). Ponder the words of the passage that stood out to you. Allow yourself to be moved by the Word of God to discover its meaning for your life.
- 4. Prayer (oratio). Speak to God about the passage. Be yourself. Allow time for silence to let God speak back to you. In this prayerful engagement with the Bible passage, you open yourself up to the possibility of contemplation.
- 5. Contemplation (contemplatio): Resting in silence ask, "God, show me the way."





RECIPE OF THE WEEK: Buffalo or Beef Stew

Known as tanka-me-a-lo in the Cherokee Nation, you can substitute regular beef if you're unable to find any buffalo meat in your area for this filling stew.

2 stalks celery

- 2 carrots
- 1 can stewed tomatoes
- 2 pounds buffalo/beef stew meat
- 4 quarts water
- 2 pounds red or white potatoes (not russets)
- 1 cup barley

Slice the carrots, celery, and meat into cubes about one inch long, then brown the buffalo over high heat for about three minutes. Add the water, potatoes, and carrots into a large pot and boil until tender. Add in the tomatoes, barley, and celery, and let cook for another 5 minutes or so. Pour the veggies and meat into a baking dish and place in the oven at 425 F for 30 minutes.

Meet Our Extended Family:

Sts. Isaac Jogues, Jean de Brebeuf, and Companions (Feast Day October 19)
D. 1642 – 1649

As a young Jesuit, Isaac Jogues taught literature in France. He gave up that career to work among the Huron Indians in the New World, and, in 1636, he and his companions, under the leadership of Jean de Brébeuf, arrived in Quebec. The Hurons were constantly warred upon by the Iroquois, and, in a few years, Father Jogues was captured by the Iroquois and imprisoned for 13 months. An unexpected chance for escape came to Isaac Jogues through the Dutch, and he returned to France, bearing the marks of his sufferings. But his zeal led him back once more to the fulfillment of his dreams. In a few months, he sailed for his missions among the Hurons. In 1646, he set out for Iroquois country in the belief that a recently signed peace treaty would be observed. He was captured by a Mohawk war party, and, on October 18, Father Jogues was killed.

Jean de Brébeuf was a French Jesuit who came to Canada at the age of 32 and labored there for 24 years. He went back to France when the English captured Quebec in 1629 and expelled the Jesuits but returned four years later. Although medicine men blamed the Jesuits for a smallpox epidemic among the Hurons, Jean remained with them. He composed catechisms and a dictionary in the Huron language and saw 7,000 converted before his death in 1649. Having been captured by the Iroquois at Sainte Marie, near Georgian Bay, Canada, Father Brébeuf died after four hours of extreme torture.
