Life Cycle of a Bearded Dragon

Egg- Bearded Dragons last 45-75 days during that time in the egg and they develop a skeleton and organs.

Hatchling- Bearded Dragons can take up to 48 hours to hatch and get out of the egg.

Juvenile- Is 6 months to 1 year. In this stage they are good hunters.

Sub-Adult- Its 1-2 years old.

Adult- Is 2 years old to older. At this age, the Bearded Dragons will recognize your face.





What they eat?

- Bearded Dragons are omnivores, meaning that they eat both plants and animals.
- When young they eat 80% bugs and 20% plants.
- Adults eat the opposite which are 80% plants and 20% animals.
- The kind of bugs they eat are different kinds of worms, cockroaches, crickets, and roaches.
- As plants they can eat vegetables and fruits.



Where do Bearded Dragons live?

Bearded dragons live in the wild in most of Australia. They typically prefer to stick to warm, areas like deserts, subtropical woodlands, savannas, and scrublands.



How long do they live?

- Wild bearded Dragons live up to 7 years in the wild.**
- Pet bearded Dragons live up to 15 years if they are well taken care of.**

Diseases that Bearded Dragons can get.

- **Metabolic bone disease is when a Bearded dragon gets improper calcium and lack of VitaminD3.**
- **Mouth rot is when the Bearded dragon gets an infection in their mouth or the mouth starts to rot because the dragon stresses out by being in a place that is too hot, cold or too small.**
- **Yellow fungus is caused when the Bearded Dragon stresses out under crowded unsanitary conditions.**
