 - Encourage students to create personal goals for each subject/content and schedule touchpoints to evaluate progress on their goals.
 - Share specific content resources to expand student learning in areas they may be struggling in addition to the optional <u>Khan Academy</u>.

As a Parent -

- Utilize the technology videos (Tech Bytes) to improve knowledge of technology/school-related topics to better support your student.
- Encourage your student to reveiw relevant Tech Byte videos and discuss how the content can support their learning.
- Help your student set up their free optional Khan Academy account.
- Encourage your student to use the optional <u>Khan Academy</u> resource when they need additional support with understanding course content or completing class assignments.
- Encourage your student to create their personal goals for each subject/course.
- Check-in with your student each month to see how they are progressing with their goals.
- Encourage your student to reach out to their teachers if they need additional help.

As a Student -

- When you do not understand a lesson or assignment use the optional <u>Khan Academy's</u> resources to search by specific content topic.
- When you need support with technology/school-related topics, use the Tech Bytes videos to improve your knowledge base.
- Create your personal goals for each subject/course.
- Review your goals with your Homeroom teacher and parents to see how you are progressing.
- Reach out to your teacher if you need more help in understanding or completing work.


