There has been limited discussion by the committee on the comprehensive factors that support this decision to preserve the status quo for Cooper Mountain. Remember the status quo was requested by the community for Cooper Mountain and the majority of schools in the south part of the district via hundreds of public comments. This vote will keep Cooper Mountain feeding Highland Park and continue their feeder pattern to Mountainside HS with a majority of their peers which was a priority of the committee in other decisions. This vote will also maintain walkability for Chehalem which the community requested and will saved \$50K in unnecessary transportation costs. At the start of this process the District provided 4 objectives for the Middle School Boundary Adjustment to guide and focus your recommendations. Stoller numbers without Summa are 84% in 2021 and 100% in 2025 2. Stoller numbers with Summa in Stoller are 100% in 2021 and 117% in 20253. With Summa out Stoller's number problem has been solved!!!! The board directive was approx 90% without the use of portables3. BSD said that they would not use any portables at any middle school for safety concerns.4. In several early voting sessions committee members agreed that the Summa program needs to move out of Stoller.5. Timberland in 2021 with Stoller Summa is at 95% capacity, the board directive was 90% without the use of portables. 6. Moving high number schools out of Timberland creates a massive hole in Timberland and creates islands7. The schools that are closest to meadow park are Terra Linda(2.4 miles) and Oakhills (2.8) miles. Both of which can be added to meadow park to improve the meadow park FRL, without creating islands. Findley is the farthest school of 3, (at 3.5 miles) from meadow park8. Stoller was as much a neighborhood school for Rockcreek and Findley as it was for Sato, Springville and Jacob.9. A Sato parent is particularly vocal for moving Findley not only out of its nearest school(Stoller at 1.1 mile) but also from its next nearest school(Timberland at 2.4 miles). The sole purpose of THIS is to create confusion and in bitter and pure evil taste. 							<p>Enrollment numbers across the BSD dropped by 1,663 from last school year! The majority of the losses were among elementary and middle school students. Pushing forward with changing the middle school boundaries for September 2021 does not make sense when no one knows if enrollment will continue to decline or not. I agree with the others who have advised delaying the boundary changes a year in order to gain a clearer picture of how enrollment is shifting and then determining the best path forward for middle school boundaries. This approach is best given the uncertainty of the times and to avoid poor decisions being made that could cause long-term harm. In regard to the legacy process and busing for boundary changes, the high school transition set up was a good example. The way BSD phased out the busing for legacy students with the high school boundary changes was to provide busing for two years after the boundary change took effect in order to meet the needs of the juniors and seniors that were grandfathered in. Siblings that were grandfathered who were sophomores or freshmen used those buses as well. The district set the cut off for those buses to end June 2019. After that point siblings were required to have their own transportation. They also ended the legacy grandfathering for siblings (who were not already freshmen) in 2019. For middle school transportation, as with the high school transition, it would be necessary to set a cutoff date and make it clear siblings would need to have their own transportation thereafter. Mr. Beaver and other district staff should be transparent in sharing the high school legacy and busing process under that boundary transition from not too long ago. Lastly, if or when new boundaries are finalized, no Summa programs should be housed at schools north of 26 where massive housing development growth has continued to be an issue. Summa should be located at the schools with smaller populations where there's room to accommodate as the program ebbs and flows. The Advisory Committee should have every right to provide input and receive clear plans from the district on Summa as it is a key piece of the puzzle in trying to meet student enrollment targets. Thank you for your hard work and dedication throughout this lengthy process!</p>

Please DO NOT recommend an elementary boundary adjustment process at Findley Elementary

Dear Mr. Sparks and the Middle School Boundary Advisory Committee,

Thank you for your service on this committee and all the hours you have volunteered. We are so grateful for all your efforts!

The purpose of our group letter is to share the consensus of our neighborhood against Vote 3 from March 12th that recommended a new elementary boundary adjustment process around Stoller. Specifically, to consider “adding a part of the existing Findley attendance area to Jacob Wismer”.

Our neighborhood is in one of the grid codes across from Stoller. We ask you to please reverse your decision on Vote 3 based on the following 4 reasons:

1. Moving 3 grid codes from Findley to Jacob Wismer would exacerbate the overcrowding issues at Jacob Wismer. Findley currently has a declining student population. So, it would not make sense to move students from a declining population at Findley to an overcrowded Jacob Wismer.
2. Breaking up elementary school communities which have formed over many decades does not seem worth the potential increase in walkability when there is not a consensus of wanting to do so.
3. Given the current environment and our responsibility to conserve time and resources at the district, we do not believe initiating a new boundary process is a prudent use of limited resources.
4. Recommending an elementary boundary adjustment process would continue to leave our kids in limbo, not knowing where they will attend next year, creating unnecessary stress during a time where our children are already facing a very challenging emotional time.

During the vote at the meeting on October 15th, we ask you to please rescind your decision on vote 3 and NOT recommend an elementary boundary adjustment process.
