Do you know the signs that your child might be vaping?

You are cordially invited to join us for a session designed to help parents and families with basic knowledge about e-cigarettes and vaping products, including what they look like, how they can be disguised, and their impact on health.

Many people are being persuaded by advertising to think that vaping is safe. However, during the last few months, the media has been filled with case after case of people becoming critically ill with lipid pneumonia and other respiratory illnesses [related to vaping!](#)

This session will also provide attendees with information to counter those myths and to help youth understand the risks of using vaping products – especially about their effects on the developing brain.

2nd - We are offering a Child Abuse Prevention Training for Parents/Guardians. It is an online training through Prevent Child Abuse Utah. All parent/guardians are encouraged to complete the training. If you do not have access to a computer, you may use computers here at the school. Please just stop by the front office to speak with me and I will set up access on a computer for you. This training is available in English and Spanish. Please see the details below:

Child Sexual Abuse Training for Parents or Guardians

House Bill 286 requires that elementary schools provide approved training for parents or guardians regarding child sexual abuse. This training is designed to help parents recognize warning signs of a child who is being sexually abused and provide them with effective age-appropriate methods for discussing the topic of child sexual abuse. Prevent Child Abuse Utah (PCAU) is an approved provider and they have developed an online course for parents/guardians in both English and Spanish. Instructions to access this training are provided below:

1. Select Register.
2. Complete Registration (Parents/Caregivers must select "I am a Parent of a Student" from the registration drop down box in order to access the parent course).
3. Click Register Button.
4. Click Launch Course.
5. There will be a Certificate of Completion issued at the end of the course that the user needs to print or download as a PDF.
