STATUS QUO FOR OUR DISTRICT'S SAFETY PROTOCOL

Dear West Bloomfield families,

You may have heard news reports about the latest decision of the Michigan Supreme Court stating, for a number of legal reasons, that the issuance by the Governor of executive orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic is no longer valid on a continuing basis.

We are writing to you for the purpose of letting you know that, over the past few months, we have worked with educational leaders and stakeholders at numerous levels in government, the fields of health, psychology and epidemiology, and experts in education. While that collaboration occurred under the auspices of the various executive orders whose validity the Michigan Supreme Court has called into question, there has thus far not been an order entered in any court invalidating the executive orders related to COVID-19. Also, the product of our collaboration was adopted by our Board of Education as policy for our school district. That policy survives any judicial action.

As a school district we have the responsibility to maintain safety for all of our students and staff, as well as their families. We likewise have the ability to adopt policies to keep these stakeholders safe.

After careful consideration, and unless or until we receive additional or other guidance from lawful authority, **we will be maintaining our safety protocols for the 2020-21 school year as articulated in our Return to School plan adopted under the legislatively required MI Safe Schools Roadmap**, as well as those procedures incorporated into our preparedness and response plan as it relates to COVID-19.

RULER is an evidence-based approach from the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence to teach kids about:

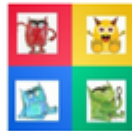
- R**ecognizing emotions in self and others
- U**nderstanding the causes and consequences of emotions
- L**abeling emotions accurately
- E**xpressing emotions appropriately
- R**egulating emotions effectively

HOW: Students will virtually receive stories and activities to help learn about emotions from "Fun with Feelings and Mrs. DeSana."

WHEN: Every other Wednesday, as part of each classroom's Cloud Learning experience.

Through **RULER**, students will be introduced to the **Mood Meter**.

The **Mood Meter** is a picture of 4 colors that helps kids recognize and label feelings. This, as well as our activities, will be referred to during in-person learning.

VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO PARENTS

Dear Parents,

West Bloomfield School District has provided several avenues for our students to receive a quality education. We are teaching in person, through zoom meetings, and online classes. We have organized zoom classes for Media, Art, Physical Education, and Music. We have provided home computers for each student and technological support for parents. In the future we will continue to provide take home bags of "work from home" items for students learning from home the 1/2 day they are not in person at school.

It is our hope that each and every student uses the resources provided to the fullest extent possible. We are here to support parents and students as they maneuver through their new

learning environment. Never before has it been more evident that education is a team experience and the successful student is one that participates regularly, has teacher encouragement and parental support. We are finding even in such challenging circumstances, students that participate regularly are learning and making good progress. That being said, when students don't participate regularly, steady progress is in jeopardy.

Oakland County monitors student attendance regularly. Two times a year a snapshot of attendance is taken and school funding is tied to those snapshots along with additional attendance data provided by the school district. Oakland County's first count date is scheduled for Wednesday, October 6th.

We would like to remind parents student attendance is recorded daily. Attendance includes participation in **ALL** zoom sessions. **The State of Michigan requires attendance to be taken** for remote learning during the daily "Live Zoom Sessions". **It is imperative that your child attend the entire Art, Music, Physical Education and I Center classes to be counted present for that portion of the day.**

Attendance will be recorded when students:

- * **Attend Zoom classes through your district issued account (stu.wbsd.org).**
- * **Use your W.B. district issued Chromebook.**
- * **Use the zoom link on the Classroom Teacher and Specials Teachers Canvas page**
- * **Students should attend their scheduled zoom.**

CHROMEBOOK ACCIDENT AND LOSS PROTECTION

Accident and loss protection for the 2020-2021 school year is available to West Bloomfield School District families for the district provided HP 11 G8 Chromebooks.

Two options are available- **Opting in** (selecting accident and loss protection) or **opting out** (full cost responsibility). REGARDLESS OF YOUR CHOICE, YOU MUST GO THROUGH THE ENROLLMENT STEPS BELOW TO SELECT IF YOU ARE OPTING IN OR OUT OF THE ACCIDENT AND LOSS PROTECTION. ANYONE RECEIVING A DISTRICT CHROMEBOOK PRIOR TO OCTOBER 7, 2020 MUST MAKE THIS CHOICE BY OCTOBER 30, 2020. IF YOU HAVE NOT MADE A CHOICE BY THEN, YOU WILL BE DEFAULTED TO THE FULL PRICE OPTION.

Any Chromebook requests after **OCTOBER 6, 2020** must be an Oakland Schools Service Desk ticket request by the parent/guardian.

IMPORTANT

*Regardless of your selection, please submit an Oakland Schools Service Desk ticket **FIRST** when you have a Chromebook damage issue, the Chromebook is lost, or the Chromebook is stolen. This way we can ensure the proper steps are being taken in a prompt and timely manner.*

OPTION 1- ACCIDENT AND LOSS PROTECTION

This is a yearly opt in. There is no refund opportunities if you do not use the accident and loss protection for the year.

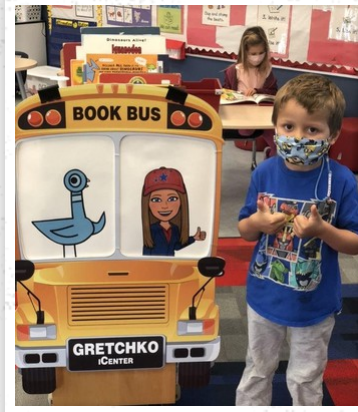

FOOD ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

The USDA has generously provided funding which allows the West Bloomfield School District to provide meals free of charge until December 31 or until funds expire to any child 18 or under or persons up to age 26 who are enrolled in an educational program that is recognized by a state or local public educational agency. Each child is eligible to receive seven breakfast and lunch meals each week.

The meal options for Gretchko families are take-home meals curbside pick-up of 7 breakfast and lunch meals at Roosevelt Elementary or West Bloomfield High School on Wednesdays. TECHNOLOGY INFORMATION

West West Bloomfield School District issued each student a new computer for educational access. It is essential that students use the computers issued for their classwork and zoom meetings. Updates and software changes are pushed to the district computers, and students not using district issued computers may not have access to the same information and programming.

Please monitor your children on the computer especially during zoom classes and meetings. We often see other individuals in the audience. Please help teachers by monitoring background noise and other interruptions of "non" class happenings.

Sometimes families forget that the computers the children are learning from, also have cameras that share whatever is in the background of the computer screen. Also, if there are conversations happening in the area, the voices and conversations are shared throughout the rest of the class. Please teach your student how and why we use the mute button.

Please join our "Special's teachers" zoom meetings through the Special's Teachers Canvas page. If you are having difficulty getting onto your Specials zoom, please follow the directions below.

- * After you click on the Specials Teacher's zoom link, close the pop up box.
- * Log in with your child's gmail account.
- * If the zoom says "connecting" please go back to the teacher's link.
- * Start again.
- * Your child's name should appear to log into zoom.
- * It should now allow you to enter the meeting.
