- Provide referrals to culturally specific services such as tribal registration, powwows, education and training, employment services, counseling and healing circles.
- o Provide a site for native cultural/spiritual ceremonies and activities.
- Provide for basic needs such as food, clothing and referral to shelters and housing programs, a mailing address and phone messages.
