Friday, December 11, 2020 4:00 pm	Applications MUST be received by 4:00 pm on Friday, December 11, 2020 to be included in the lottery for Arts & Communication Magnet Academy (ACMA), Aloha-Huber Park K-8, International School of Beaverton (ISB), Beaverton Academy of Science and Engineering, Raleigh Hills K-8, Rachel Carson School of Environment Science (RLC) and Springville K-8.
Wednesday, December 16, 2020	Lottery conducted for programs where the number of applicants exceeds space available. Lottery is not public.
Thursday, December 17, 2020	Letters offering enrollment or notification of wait-pool status will be sent via the email address listed on the application. Result cannot be given over the phone.
Thursday, December 17, 2020 to Monday, January 11, 2021	Second Consideration: Students who are not selected in the first round of the lottery will receive an email indicating their wait-pool status and the opportunity to participate in Second Consideration - if available. Students who want to be considered for Second Consideration must notify their applicant school well before the Monday, January 11, 2021 deadline.
Wednesday, February 3, 2021	Deadline for acceptance of enrollment offer. Families have the option to accept by: (1) using the Online Response Form , (2) scanning acceptance form to options@beaverton.k12.or.us , (3) mailing response form to the address listed above -- must be postmarked no later than Wednesday, February 3, 2021, or hand-delivered to the Beaverton School District Learning Options Office by 4:00 PM Wednesday, February 3, 2021.
Any openings remaining as a result of students declining enrollment offers and/or after the Second Consideration process will be filled from the wait pool. Students can still request enrollment following the first round of placement, though openings may be extremely limited.	

K-8 Schools - Fifth-grade students who attend Aloha Huber Park will have priority for 6th-grade enrollment in their school. AHP will only accept applications of students that live within the school boundary. Raleigh Hills and Springville will only be accepting applications for 7th and 8th grade, as they phase out their K-8 model.
