Cash or checks made out to SLCSD are accepted. Please fill out the permission slip and return the form along with cash or check to the office as soon as possible.



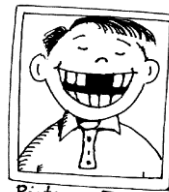
## Food Bank truck comes to North Star on November 11
