there!

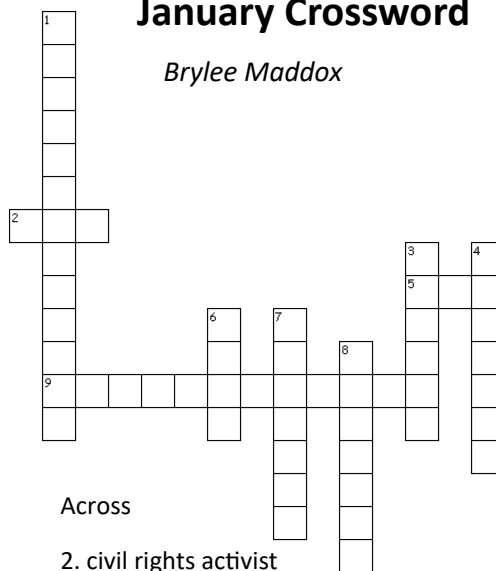

Oreo Crunch

Ingredients:

- 32 Oreos (1 package)
- 6 tbs butter
- 8 oz cream cheese (1 package)
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1 (12 oz) container of Cool Whip
- 2 packages of chocolate pudding
- 3 1/4 cups milk

Directions

1. Crush up the Oreos and mix in butter. Mix well. Then press mixture into a 9x13 in baking pan and refrigerate for now.
2. While crust is in the refrigerator, beat cream cheese until fluffy. Add sugar and 2 tbs of milk. Mix well. Stir in 1/4 cup of Cool Whip. Spread mixture onto crust and put back in the fridge.
3. After you do that, make chocolate pudding. Let cool and spread onto crust, then put back in the fridge for 10 minutes.
4. Optional: Spread Cool Whip and chocolate chips on the top.
5. Serve and enjoy as a family dessert!
