# **College Board Exams**

October 27 is SBISD's In-School SAT for seniors. Since we have no seniors, we will not need teachers or rooms to proctor the exam. In-person middle school students will report to Stratford for simultaneous classes that day. Like other Stratford students, SBAI students grades 9 – 11 will learn virtually. There will be Zoom sessions with SBAI high school teachers only. Stratford teachers will be proctoring, thus unavailable for Zoom sessions.

October 29 SBAI and SBISD will be administering the PSAT – 10. We will test our sophomores, both inperson and virtual, in the SBAI pod. We will need rooms, teachers, and a quiet environment to administer the exam. Like other freshmen and juniors in the district, non-testers in high school will have a virtual, asynchronous day. Middle school students will spend the entire day at SFMS attending elective classes normally while having virtual, asynchronous classes with SBAI teachers.

### **Science Fair**

SBAI's third annual science fair is under way. The science fair is part of the SBAI middle-school science curriculum. We are inviting high school students to participate as well. Through the development and presentation of science/engineering projects, students enhance the following abilities: making observations, asking questions regarding particular phenomena or situations, formulating ideas and procedures for the solution of a problem, using complex and/or analytical reasoning skills to find an answer or a solution to a problem, and effectively presenting their works to society. Colleges look for students who establish and nurture a clear passion and expertise in whatever they choose to pursue. Volunteering to compete in science fair would show that passion. All experiments and data analysis is to be completed before winter break. The SBAI Science Fair will be on Friday, January 8, 2021. We will have enough time to register SBAI winners for Science and Enginerring Fair of Houston. Registration and date of SEFH are still to be determined.
