## Attendance Requirements and Sample Schedules

Duncanville ISD will begin the 2020-2021 school year with virtual learning for at least the first 4 weeks of school. Although students will be learning at home, expectations for attendance and curriculum for the start of this year will more closely follow traditional school requirements than the classes students experienced at the end of last school year.

#### Attendance

Beginning Sept. 8, teachers will take daily attendance based on the student's participation in online learning and the completion of independent work.

All students must either submit an assignment or activity, interact with their classroom teacher or work in their virtual classroom for each class or subject each day by 11:59 p.m. to be counted present.

#### Live and Recorded Instruction

Students have the option of participating in *live* sessions, viewing *recorded* lessons or a combination of both. Teachers will post all lessons, assignments and *recorded* instructional sessions online via Google Classroom.

To get the most out of virtual learning, students are encouraged to engage with teachers and classmates through *live* lessons. All students will have the option to participate in *live* lessons, *live* question-and-answer sessions and *live* small group instruction scheduled at specific times by their teachers. Teachers will use a combination of *live* learning sessions followed by time for students to complete independent work. The schedule will also include lunch and other breaks throughout the day.

If students are not able to view a class live, they can utilize the *recorded* instruction. Teachers will record their daily lessons and make them available to students through Google Classroom. Students will not be penalized for missing live sessions with the instructor. Students can view *recorded* lessons and complete pre-assigned work on their own as long as they turn it in daily by 11:59 p.m.

### **Technology Department to Begin Device Distribution**



Starting September 1, the Technology Department will begin distributing about 3,800 loaner devices with a focus on initially providing one device per household. Students and their families will be notified by email and phone that they will receive a loaner device. <u>To ensure you can be reached, all families should confirm that the email and phone number listed in Skyward Family Access is current,</u>

The district has purchased more than 6,000 new devices using the \$2.8 million approved this summer by the Board of Trustees. Due to the purchase demand from schools across the nation, not all devices will be here before the start of school. As new devices arrive, they will be distributed to students and staff as soon as possible.

### Pre-Orders Required for Curbside Meal Service During Virtual Learning

The start of school means the return of serving meals to students. All virtual learners will have the opportunity to receive a weekly meal bundle through contactless curbside pickup at the student's home campus. If a family has students at different locations, meals can be obtained at one campus of choice.

Each student will receive a meal bundle of five breakfast and five lunch meals consisting of whole grains, fruits, vegetables, protein, and milk. Breakfast is free to all



students. Those who qualify will receive free lunch, others will be required to pay either \$2.00/week (reduced) or \$15/week (paid).

One notable change to the usual way meals are provided is that **meals must be pre-ordered each Wednesday by 1:30 p.m. for the following week.** Parents/guardians can call or email your child's campus cafeteria manager to reserve your meals. It is important to note that <u>the first week of school meal orders must be placed by September 2,</u> 2020
