INFORMATION FOR THE PARENTS

Dual Enrollment students are treated like regularly admitted college students. I understand that:

- My child is exposed to an educational environment designed for the adult learner, which may involve topics that may be considered controversial or offensive.
- I *will not* have access to my child's records (registration status, grades, etc.) without his/her written consent. Educational privacy rights transfer to the student once they enroll in a college. (Ed.Cd. 49061)
- All courses are offered for college credit.
- My child is responsible for paying all required fees upon enrollment; enrollment fees, material fees and parking fees.
- All college coursework and grades become a part of the student's official college academic history and transcript. These grades will not be changed or erased. There are age and or grade level restrictions that apply to some VVC courses.
- Poor grades can have a far reaching effect, future admission to college or university of choice, eligibility for financial aid, etc.
- Student is expected to meet all deadlines, classes must be dropped within the stated deadlines.
- Attendance is required, but not monitored. No one will call if the student misses class.

INFORMATION FOR STUDENT

<u>All classes are offered for college credit</u>. Generally, you may enroll in any course for which you are recommended, and meet course prerequisites, however, please see "Age/Grade Level Restrictions by Course".

I understand when I enroll in a class at Victor Valley College that:

- I must abide by all college policies, regulations and standards.
- I am expected to conduct all college business including, but not limited to submitting my admissions forms, registering and dropping my classes, and requesting my official transcripts as needed
- I am limited to enrolling in a maximum of: Non CCAP up to 11.5 units Fall/Spring, 8 units Winter/Summer, CCAP 15 units/4 courses. Non-CCAP students will receive a low priority registration block so as to not displace regularly admitted students.
- I will only be enrolled for course(s) that have been recommended by my school principal/designee.
- Be aware that there are age and or grade level restrictions that apply to some VVC courses.
- I must submit a new Dual Enrollment form for every new semester I wish to attend until I graduate from high school.
