



## ***Questions from the 10/13/2020 Board Meeting***

1. **What is the plan moving forward for scheduling for the elementary?** As of now, the elementary students will continue to attend school for a half day M/T/TH/F.
  
2. **The curriculum for the middle school two days in person and then what is the purpose for asynchronous days?** The asynchronous days provide time for teachers to plan with their colleagues, provide interventions and help students in small groups
  
3. **Are we still on track for reopening RHS?** As of today, 10/15/20, we are.
  
4. **How are we able to send students back if we are not aware of TRUE test results?** We are following the guidelines from the Health Department, just as all other schools in the County. This includes 10 days since symptoms first appeared and at least 24 hours with no fever. For someone who is a “close contact” it is 14 days since the last date of the exposure of the person who tested positive.
  
5. **Is there a way to view the dashboard on a mobile device?** Yes, if you go to a school’s website at the top is a menu button. Each school has a COVID-19 dashboard tab that takes you right to it.
  
6. **How old is the policy that says all communications must include an address?** It was last updated in August, 2017.A
  
7. **How is the air quality in the schools?**

**Bernie Bowers our Director of Maintenance reported the following:**

All WPS buildings use a monthly preventative maintenance program. (see Garfield’s, which is attached)

There are three engineers at RHS, (someone is in the building 7 days a week from 7AM to 11PM) two at Wilson (7-3 and 3-11) and one at each of the elementary schools.(7-3)

Maintenance is done every month on the equipment throughout the buildings.



Buildings are also monitored by four computers and two cell phones throughout the District to monitor all fan units and boilers through a program with Johnson Controls called Metasys.

The State mandates we bring in 20% outside/fresh air when buildings are occupied.

With the bond that was passed two years ago we installed new rooftop units for AC and air at RHS and WMS. At Monroe we installed two new boilers, two hot water lines and air handler units in the classrooms. All other building had repairs of coils and dampers.

In 2008-2009 we were the only school district in the state of Michigan to receive the Energy Star Award presented by the Federal Government.

Even though our buildings are all dated between 1932 and 1958 the tax payers of Wyandotte do a great job passing bonds that allow us to maintain and improve these older buildings.
