2. Review and approve minutes **Nicole Burnham motioned to approve. Alzina Barnhill second motioned to approve. All were in favor.**

3. Principal's Report on school items

- a) Report for October 20th requirement **Hard copies and emails sent to every household.**
- b) Discuss previous year's RISE/CRT results **These results are not in quite yet.**
- c) Review SIP 2020 – 2021 **ne We had 508 students use Imagine Learning, 95% of the students met their usage goal. We were #2 for the number of users. 671 students used ST Math they spent 926,043 minutes and completed 1,373,570 puzzles. With Imagine Math students were on track to meet the goals up until March 15th.**
- d) Progress update on goals **When we compare last year MOY to this year BOY we are starting the year a bit behind the district on all grade levels. Students are logging on and using ST Math, Reflex, and Dreambox. It has felt like a slow start but it is underway now. On ST Math we are averaging one puzzle mastered per minute. With 596 students logging in, 139,187 puzzles collected and 1,105 Objectives Collected.**
- e) Teaching Assistant **All teaching assistants are in place and small groups have started in most of the grades.**

a) Update on Budget **There is \$12,750 left from carryover from last year and being underbudget on licenses. Natalie Argyle proposed to hire two teaching assistants to help students in the low performing subgroups. Nyla Weaver second that motion and all were in favor.**

b) Review Goals

a. Last year's goals

- i. Cook elementary will increase the number of students proficient on DIBELS composite by 12% from BOY to EOY.
- ii. 80% of students across grades 1-4 will achieve automaticity in their math facts as measured by Reflex Math at the EOY. 80% of students 5-6 will achieve proficiency on Imagine Math benchmarks.

b. This year's goals

- i. Math Goal: Cook elementary will increase student mean growth in math as measured by performance on the CRT/RISE assessments by 5% from a MGP of 39 2018-19 school year to a MGP of 44 in the 2020-21 school year. (We will be looking at how to adjust this goal.)
- ii. ELA Goal: Cook Elementary will increase the number of students proficient on Acadience testing composite score by 10% by BOY to MOY during the 2020-21 school year.
- iii. SEL Goal: Build foundational knowledge and capacity for faculty and staff in the five CASEL competencies of self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making adults by creating a school SEL plan using the Davis School District's SEL Walkthrough Tool.
