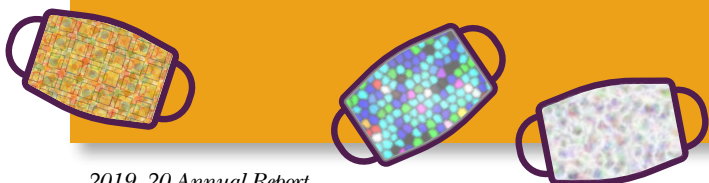

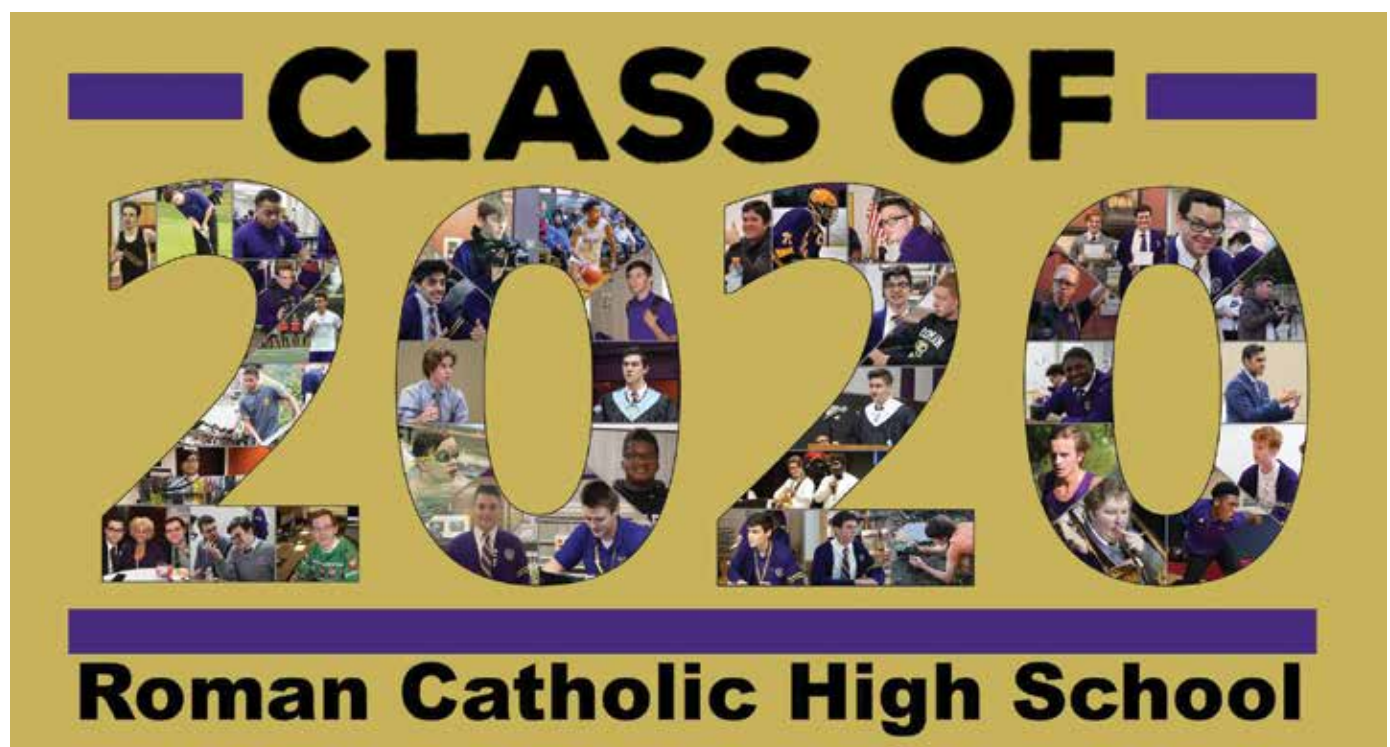

Ways to Continue the Cahill Legacy

Roman Catholic High School opened in 1890 through the vision and generosity of Philadelphia businessman, Thomas E. Cahill. Mr. Cahill believed that no young man should be deprived of a rigorous, morals-based education, because his family was economically challenged. Education, Mr. Cahill understood, was the key to building a strong and prosperous society. Since opening, over 20,000 young men have received a high quality, comprehensive education.

Give Online: Gifts can be made online through our secure server. Visit www.RomanCatholicHS.com/romanfund and give any time.

Give by Mail or Phone: Cash, Check, and Credit Card gifts can always be made by direct mail. Checks can be made out to "Roman Catholic High School" and mailed to 301 N. Broad Street, Philadelphia, PA, 19107. Gifts can also be made over the phone via credit card by calling (215)-627-5487.

Match your Gift: Many companies offer matching gift policies that can double or triple a contribution made to Roman by one of its employees. Check with your human resources department or the Office of Mission Advancement to find out if your employer will match your gift.

IRA Rollover: This summary describes the important advantages and steps in making a qualified charitable distribution from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA), commonly referred to as a IRA charitable rollover.

The IRS has authorized charitable gifts from IRAs. Among the provisions of the bill is an exclusion from gross income for income tax purposes of up to \$100,000 (for each IRA account owner) for "qualified charitable distributions" from an IRA. The distribution will count toward an individual's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).

Plan your Gift: There are a variety of estate and planned giving opportunities, including gifts of securities, bequests, retirement assets, charitable trusts, insurance, IRA rollovers, stocks and annuities, retained life estate and other assets.

Sustain your Gift: Decide how much you want to contribute and your bank will automatically deduct your gift from your account on a monthly basis. A modest gift given every month can equal a significant gift by year's end.

EITC: Pennsylvania's Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program allow businesses and individuals to direct the monies they pay in taxes to go towards providing financial aid and scholarships for Roman students. For a two year commitment you receive a tax credit for 90% of your contribution. It is easy to apply! Please view page 40 of this publication for more information on this program.

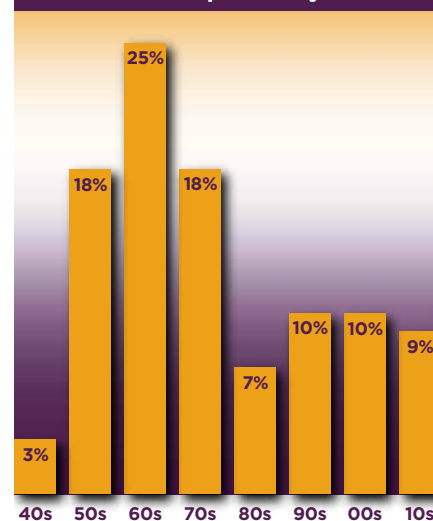

In the competitive world of high school admissions, what led the family to choosing to send their son to Roman Catholic? We didn't initially choose Roman – Phelim did. We went into the admissions process fairly certain that he would be at St. Joseph's Prep. We had positive interactions at every turn with Roman, but we were convinced that St. Joe's would be a better fit for him. Phelim saw things differently. By Christmas break during his eighth-grade year, he was adamant that while St. Joe's was a great school, it wasn't the right school for him. Roman was. He was right. We're grateful we followed his lead.

What were you and your son involved in at Roman? Phelim played freshman football, was a student ambassador, and rowed crew for four years.

Our involvement followed suit. We became pretty ingrained into the Roman Crew family over the past four years.

How has Roman impacted you as a family, as parents, and for your son? Our family has a long connection to Roman. Phelim's grandfather, Eddie Griffin, graduated in 1954. He was a proud Roman alum who regularly sang the Alma Mater and, once Roman extended its enrollment beyond traditional parish boundaries, could be found sitting on his front step talking up Roman to the graduating eighth graders in the neighborhood.

We hoped that Roman Catholic would be the right place for Phelim. That he would feel for his high school the way we have always felt about ours. We could have never imagined the way Broad and Vine would take root in him. It's been a blessing to watch.

How has Roman helped your son excel? Roman has instilled such an incredible sense of community into Phelim. His understanding of being part of something bigger than himself took shape over the past four years. Phelim developed a true sense of self while there – understanding what's expected of him as a man, and the importance of integrity and contribution.

What makes Roman unique? Two things rise to the top: The brotherhood –it's foundational and formative in all the best ways; and the commitment of the faculty and administration to the students.



Why do you feel it is important for people to support Roman? Roman Catholic High School has been demonstrating its commitment to young men for 130 years. Faculty Profile: Pat Shanahan

After 31 years, 28 consecutively, of teaching business at Roman, Mr. Pat Shanahan has decided to retire. As a teacher and coach, he set high expectations for his students and committed himself to helping them to develop intellectually and athletically. Without a doubt, Mr. Shanahan has left a lasting impact on the Roman Community and especially on the lives of generations of students and student-athletes. Well-done, Mr. Shanahan! You will be missed!

What motivated you to be a teacher? I was a good student and enjoyed the classroom dynamic my whole life. I had some teachers that gave me new perspectives and allowed me to see different possibilities. Effective teachers “expose” students to new things and the students can take it from there. I wanted to be able to positively affect young people like that. I love how you get a fresh start each year, each quarter, each day... even each class period. If it doesn't work in this class, I can try something different in the next. Christmas, Easter, and summers off sealed the deal! As a teacher, I was able to have great experiences with my own two sons each summer of their upbringing.

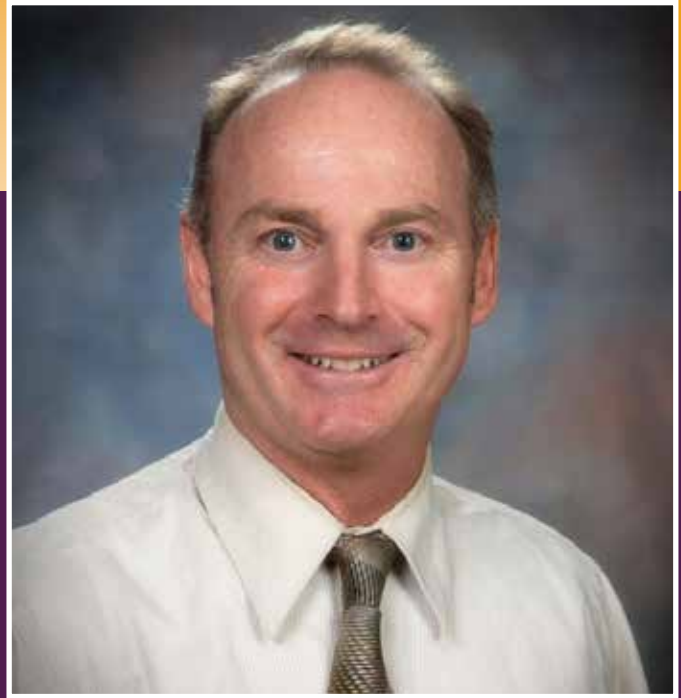
What motivated you to teach business? I was a double major (Management/Psychology, with a Law minor) and the Catholic Schools allowed teachers to teach their major. What we teach in Roman's business department is extremely useful for a young man to learn early on. Banking, Credit, Insurance, saving, investing, Economics, real estate, and more. If you learn these things while in high school, you have a great advantage in achieving financial success over those that never were taught or learned later. It's like a “head start” in a race. One of my sayings in class is...

“Money is NOT the MOST important thing in life. But it is important.”

Hopefully I was able to give our students a head-start in the adult world of money, and hence improve the quality of their lives.

What was your pathway to Roman? I taught two years at Neumann thanks to a chance encounter with the Principal who happened to need a business teacher. At that time, I was working in the burgeoning electronics industry of the early 1980's, but it didn't feel right. But after two years at Neumann I was constricted. I went to the constriction meeting and a Roman Business spot was available. In the summer of 1987, no one wanted to go to Roman. It was almost closed and struggling. It was exactly the kind of mission I felt passionate about. Inner city students, close to my South Philly home, and in need of a comeback. I was inspired to be part of the Renaissance. I nervously watched as teacher after teacher refused to pick the Roman job. When it came my turn in seniority order, I jumped on it.

What will you remember most about your time teaching at Roman? What are some of your greatest memories? What do you cherish most? I'll never forget arriving in the fall of 1987 and the legendary teacher that I was to replace (Tony Grecco) walking me around the building introducing me to every single person with his arm around me as he smoked his pipe. I especially loved my Business Law classes where we could learn about law, politics, current events, recent history, and relevant business concepts. For most of my years, those classes were seniors and I really enjoyed prepping those guys to leave Roman and succeed. But I will cherish my memories of great graduation ceremonies including many inspiring Valedictorian speeches. I especially enjoyed Veterans Day assemblies,



Blue Mass of Thanksgiving, my guest speakers, walking trips, Palestra basketball games, coaching 21 different Roman tennis teams, and all the interesting students. But the relationships I've been blessed to have with all the Roman faculty, staff, and administrators are the cherry on top of it all.

What I cherish most was being part of the Roman tradition and now being a Cahillite.

What impact do you feel you had on Roman and your students? I hope the school and my students are more aware of WASTE. I think the world wastes too much and not many people seem aware. I hope I empowered them to take control of their outcomes instead of being “victims” to circumstances. I tried lots of things to “spark” the students...music, guest speakers, video, 7 Habits book, walking trips, and more. I hope I challenged them to grow and leave their comfort zones. I hope they are more open-minded, kind, and generous as a result of our time together.

What impact did Roman and your students have on you? They taught me kindness and generosity. They made me laugh often. They taught me to have more empathy and understanding for each person's unique circumstances. Each person has a cross to bear and my students made me very aware of just how much variety there is in this world for “crosses to bear.” I have great respect for my students and how they got to Roman each day and fought through the adversity that each had in his life.

What do you feel makes Roman unique in today's world? The diversity...racial, ethnic, socio-economic, intellectual, geographic. There are not many schools that offer all that diversity. It's a unique and invaluable part of a young man's education. Other unique features are that it's located in Center City with all the cultural and educational resources near us, and it has over 130 years of tradition.

Why do you give back to Roman? Roman's very existence is a product of philanthropy by Thomas E. and Sophia Cahill. Its continued existence requires more. Since I love it and want it to survive, I am compelled to give back.

What is your vision for the future of Roman? I want Roman to stay true to its principles; respect, responsibility, discipline, faith. Also, as the Catholic faith is shrinking in size, Roman could be converting new members to our beautiful faith tradition. We still do a wonderful job integrating the Catholic traditions in the school's daily life.

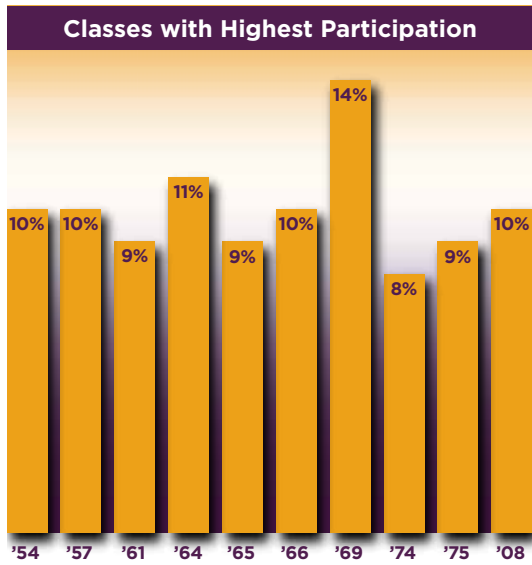

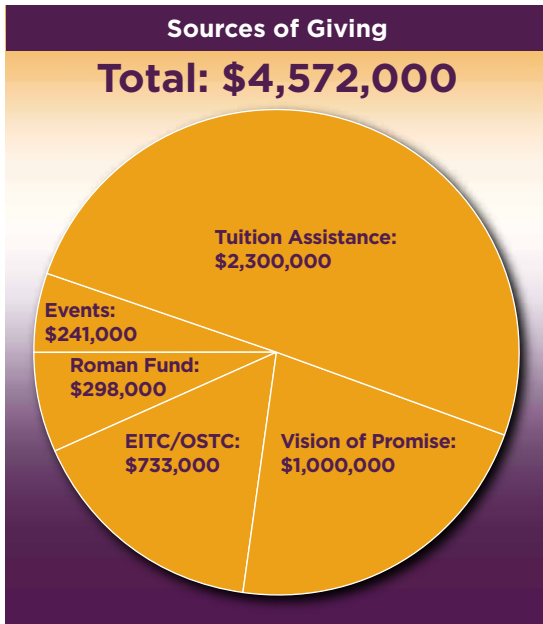

EITC (Education Improvement) & OSTC (Opportunity Scholarship) Tax Credit program

What is the tax credit?

The state tax credit program allows businesses and or individuals who pay Pennsylvania taxes to redirect their tax dollars to Roman Catholic High School in the form of tuition assistance and financial aid rather than the state government.

How does it work?

There is a simple, one-page form that you can fill out. From there Roman Catholic and an accredited scholarship organization will handle the rest. You just have to submit your contribution to the along with a letter designating your gift for Roman Catholic High School within 60 days of approval. The scholarship organization will send you a letter verifying you have made your contribution and you send that letter to the state. Then the state will issue your tax credit.

How much is the tax credit?

For a one year commitment you will receive a tax credit for 75% of your contribution. For a two year commitment you will receive a tax credit for 90% of your contribution.

What is the money used for?

All monies allocated to Roman Catholic High School are used to provide tuition assistance to families so that students can have a quality Catholic education.

The EITC and OSTC are tremendous tools for Pennsylvania businesses and taxpayers to provide much needed tuition assistance to families who want to send their sons to Roman.

What have you been doing since you graduated Roman?

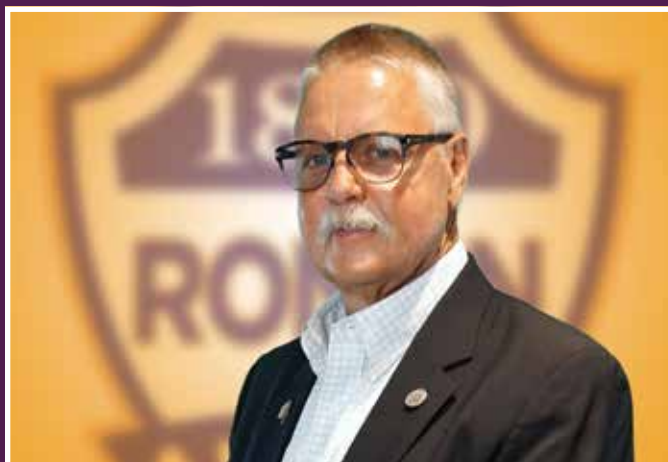
After Roman and Drexel, I married my wife, Lisa, (40th wedding anniversary this year) and raised four kids, three girls and one boy, while pursuing my career in environmental engineering work. I spent many of those years playing soccer, running a youth soccer club and coaching at four different soccer clubs until I was 58. I am currently President of an environmental services company with offices nationwide and I am enjoying life with my wife, kids, three grandchildren, extended family and friends.

What did Roman offer to you? Roman offered me the chance to go to school in a environment different from my neighborhood and to learn from and about different cultures and ethnic backgrounds while in the middle of Center City. The early seventies were difficult times for the City and the Country and Roman's location and student body offered the opportunity to learn and grow in ways that other high schools could not match.

What do you remember most about your time at Roman?

I remember many things from Roman like: ugly plaid sport coats and bell bottom pants; taking the subway to get to our soccer field at 9th & Hunting Park and getting changed into our soccer gear outside since we had no locker room; climbing all of those stairs to the classroom near the gym and band room; or sweating in the basement classes during summer months. Most importantly, I remember the friendships and bonds developed at Roman with my classmates. I was good friends with five guys from Upper Roxborough when I went to Roman in 1971. In those four years at Roman, this group became really close with six other guys from Manayunk, Lower Roxborough, East Falls and North Philly. The dozen of us eventually became "The Goons." We have stayed friends for all of our lives and now "The Goons" and our wives, kids and grandkids are one big extended family. This all happened because of Roman.

What do you feel makes Roman unique? The thing that stands out the most to me is the sense of belonging that Roman gives you which stays with you after graduation. I think this is why the Alumni is so strong. I have friends from many classes at Roman and that kinship is very unique and also translates to developing and maintaining relationships beyond the Purple and Gold. I think Roman still provides that today and it is an invaluable asset which we all have for life.



What motivates you to stay loyal and active? I think we understand that Roman gave something to us and it is important to give back. This applies not just to Roman but in other aspects of life.

Why do you give back to Roman? First, I have been very fortunate with family, friends and career which has allowed me to give back to Roman. The experiences that I had at Roman made much of this happen. I give back so that hopefully others can have this same Roman experience. This includes supporting the soccer team which was such a big part of my high school experience. The team has been very successful and our current coach, Ray Destephanis, does a great job with the team and keeping the alumni involved. This is all part of the Roman experience.

Why do you believe it is important for others to give back? Roman can't survive without the support of its alumni. Whether it is time or money, others giving back to help Roman continue to thrive is essential to allow this and future generations to have the same experience that we had, which has been so important in our lives.

Why did you decide to participate in the EITC program? The EITC program offers Roman the chance to get some of my taxes that I pay to the State from my paycheck every week. I would rather have my taxes go to Roman where I know that this money is being used productively. The program enabled me to donate a much larger amount to Roman than I normally would through a standard donation.

What would you say to someone who is thinking about participating in the program? If you are working in PA and paying state taxes, you can probably qualify for this program to allow Roman to get some of your state tax money. 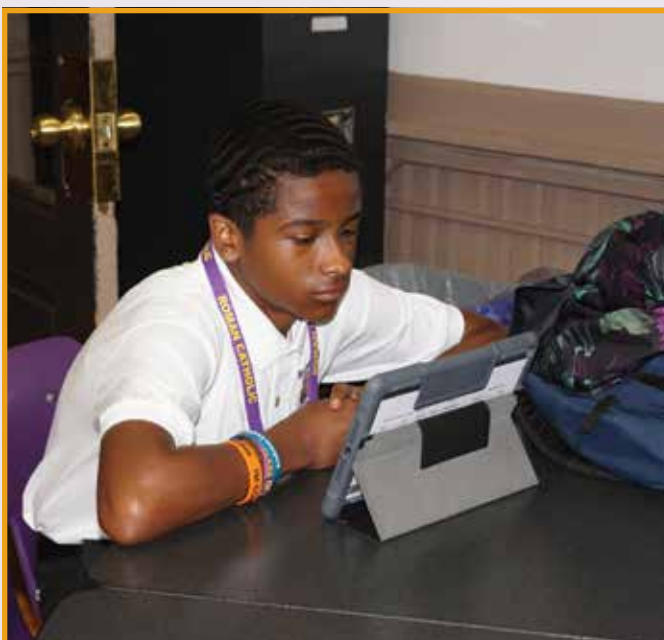

Vietnam Restaurant/Café

Vietnam Restaurant in Chinatown was opened in 1984 by Nhu Lai and Thuyen Luu. The restaurant was passed down to their son, Benny Lai, in 1992. Benny is the father of Cahillites Jonathan Lai '14 and Justin Lai '18.

This business was purchased with one goal in mind, to offer more diverse food in the area. With the large refugee community in Philadelphia, the Lai family saw this as an opportunity to serve home cooked, family recipes that cater to the Vietnamese community.

Since then, the family has been able to expand into University City, where they opened their second location

in 2007 called Vietnam Café. This expansion introduced authentic Vietnamese food to a non-Asian clientele. Along with the expansion of the second restaurant, Benny bolstered the menu, adding in a variety of different dishes. Benny runs this restaurant with his wife Tammy, along with the help from his two sons.

When asked how Roman has helped the brothers in life and in business, the two agreed that Roman has taught them many skills teenagers lack: "With the incredible support from the faculty and staff, Roman has given us the communication skills needed to talk with our customers in a way that is professional and gracious. We are grateful for the confidence they have given us through this education. These skills come from more than just the classroom. These skills are taught outside of the classroom with the sense of community that Roman provides. Roman Catholic does not lie when they promise we enter as boys and leave as men." The Lai brothers are grateful for the experience Roman has given to them. With the large amount of support that Roman provides, the Lai family still feels Roman's impact even after graduation.

Charlie Lyons '68 is retired and living in Eloy, AZ with his wife Barbara. They just celebrated their 45th wedding anniversary.

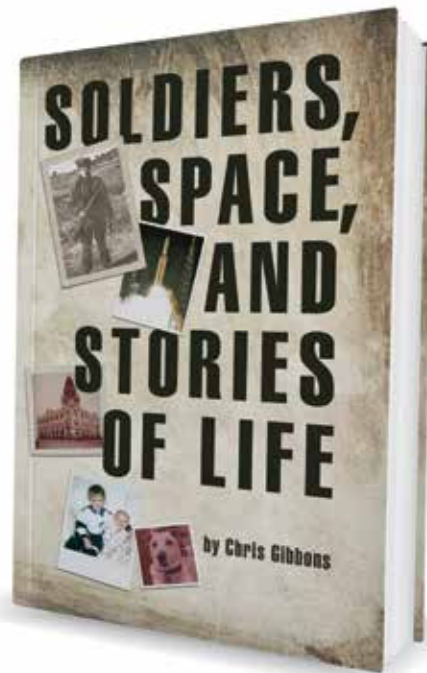

A two-time first-team All-Big Ten Conference selection, Stevens started all 135 games in his career with 115 double-figure scoring games and 4,532 career minutes played. His participation in community efforts included his children's book "Lamar's Climb: A Journey to Happy Valley" which involved six individuals, all with special needs and who were connected to the men's basketball program.

Stevens was one of only two Nittany Lions in program history with more than 2,000 career points and 800 career rebounds. With the cancellation of the Big Ten Tournament due to the COVID-19 pandemic, his career came to an end with 2,207 points, ranked No. 2 on the program's all-time scoring list.

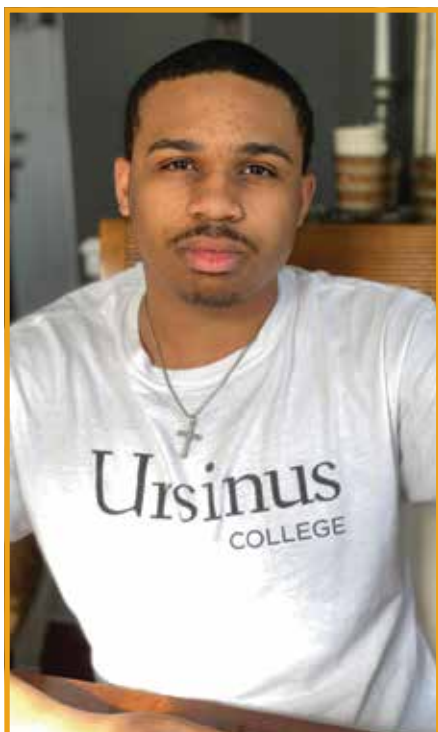

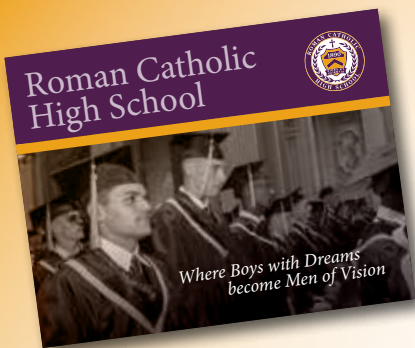
